- *Plead or ask for earnestly.*



## Synonyms of "Crave" as a verb (26 Words)

<b>apply for</b>	Apply to a surface.
<b>ask for</b>	Require or ask for as a price or condition.
<b>aspire to</b>	Have an ambitious plan or a lofty goal.
<b>be bent on</b>	Work in a specific place, with a specific subject, or in a specific function.
<b>beg</b>	Acquire food or money from someone by begging. <i>He <b>begged</b> his fellow passengers for help.</i>
<b>call for</b>	Get or try to get into communication (with someone) by telephone.
<b>canvass</b>	Solicit votes from potential voters in an electoral campaign. <i>They re <b>canvassing</b> support among shareholders.</i>
<b>dream of</b>	Have a daydream; indulge in a fantasy.
<b>drum up</b>	Play a percussion instrument.
<b>have as one's aim</b>	Cause to be born.
<b>have as one's goal</b>	Cause to be born.
<b>hunger</b>	Feel or suffer hunger. <i>When he had fasted forty days and forty nights he afterwards <b>hungered</b>.</i>
<b>hunger for</b>	Feel the need to eat.
<b>long for</b>	Desire strongly or persistently.

<b>plead for</b>	Offer as an excuse or plea.
<b>press for</b>	Press from a plastic.
<b>put in for</b>	Estimate.
<b>request</b>	Inquire for (information). <i>She <b>requested</b> an extra bed in her room.</i>
<b>seek</b>	Attempt to find (something). <i>She always <b>seeks</b> to do good in the world.</i>
<b>set one's heart on</b>	Put into a position that will restore a normal state.
<b><u>starve</u></b>	Die of food deprivation. <i>The arts are being <b>starved</b> of funds.</i>
<b>sue for</b>	Institute legal proceedings against; file a suit against.
<b>thirst</b>	Have a strong desire for something. <i>A few could drink while many <b>thirsted</b>.</i>
<b>thirst for</b>	Have a craving, appetite, or great desire for.
<b>yearn for</b>	Have a desire for something or someone who is not present.



## Usage Examples of "Crave" as a verb

- *Will craved for family life.*
- *If only she had shown her daughter the love she craved.*
- *I must crave your indulgence.*



## Associations of "Crave" (30 Words)

### **aspire**

Rise high; tower.  
*Other people will **aspire** to be like you.*

### **beg**

Acquire food or money from someone by begging.  
*She **begged** me to say nothing to her father.*

### **beseech**

Ask (someone) urgently and fervently to do something; implore; entreat.  
*You have got to believe me Violet **beseech**ed him.*

### **cadge**

Obtain or seek to obtain by cadging or wheedling.  
*He **cadged** fivers off old school friends.*

<b>covet</b>	Yearn to possess (something, especially something belonging to another). <i>I <b>covet</b> one of their smart bags.</i>
<b>craving</b>	An intense desire for some particular thing. <i>A <b>craving</b> for chocolate.</i>
<b>desideratum</b>	Something that is needed or wanted. <i>Integrity was a <b>desideratum</b>.</i>
<b>desire</b>	Express a desire for. <i>There had been a time years ago when he had <b>desired</b> her.</i>
<b>entreat</b>	Treat (someone) in a specified manner. <i>His friends <b>entreated</b> him not to go.</i>
<b>hanker</b>	Feel a strong desire for or to do something. <i>She <b>hankered</b> to go back.</i>
<b>hankering</b>	A yearning for something or to do something. <i>He had a <b>hankering</b> to return to Scotland.</i>
<b>hunger</b>	Feel or suffer hunger. <i>She was faint with <b>hunger</b>.</i>
<b>implore</b>	Beg someone earnestly or desperately to do something. <i>I <b>implore</b> mercy.</i>
<b>indigence</b>	A state of extreme poverty; destitution. <i>Their <b>indigence</b> appalled him.</i>
<b>insatiable</b>	Of a person having an insatiable appetite or desire for something especially sex. <i>So <b>insatiable</b> a gourmand as myself.</i>
<b>longing</b>	Having or showing a yearning desire. <i>A tale of love and <b>longing</b>.</i>
<b>need</b>	Have or feel a need for. <i>His day to day <b>needs</b>.</i>
<b>petition</b>	Write a petition for something to somebody request formally and in writing. <i>A steady stream of <b>petitions</b> to Allah were audible.</i>
<b>plea</b>	(law) a defendant's answer by a factual matter (as distinguished from a demurrer). <i>He changed his <b>plea</b> to not guilty.</i>
<b>plead</b>	Make an allegation in an action or other legal proceeding especially answer the previous pleading of the other party by denying facts therein stated or by alleging new facts. <i>The idea that in public relations work someone is paid to <b>plead</b> a special case is disliked.</i>

<b>pray</b>	Address a deity a prophet a saint or an object of worship say a prayer. <i>Ladies and gentlemen <b>pray</b> be seated.</i>
<b>request</b>	A formal message requesting something that is submitted to an authority. <i>The club s excursion was postponed at the <b>request</b> of some of the members.</i>
<b>starve</b>	Be freezing cold. <i>The arts are being <b>starved</b> of funds.</i>
<b>suppliant</b>	Making or expressing a plea, especially to someone in power or authority. <i>A <b>suppliant</b> for her favors.</i>
<b>supplicate</b>	Ask humbly (for something). <i>He <b>supplicated</b> the King for clemency.</i>
<b>thirst</b>	A feeling of needing or wanting to drink something. <i>A <b>thirst</b> for knowledge.</i>
<b>unquenchable</b>	Impossible to quench. <i><b>Unquenchable</b> thirst.</i>
<b>want</b>	Hunt or look for want for a particular reason. <i>I <b>want</b> my own room.</i>
<b>yearn</b>	Be filled with compassion or warm feeling. <i>No fellow spirit <b>yearned</b> towards her.</i>
<b>yearning</b>	Involving or expressing yearning. <i>A <b>yearning</b> hope.</i>
