hankering A yearning for something or to do something.

¹⁹ He had a **hankering** to return to Scotland.

A feeling of discomfort or weakness caused by lack of food, coupled with the

hunger desire to eat.

They died from cold and hunger.

hungering A physiological need for food; the consequence of food deprivation.

longing A yearning desire.

Miranda felt a wistful **longing** for the old days.

need A thing that is wanted or required.

He had sufficient means to meet his simple **need**s.

pining Straight-grained durable and often resinous white to yellowish timber of any of

numerous trees of the genus Pinus.

thirst Lack of the liquid needed to sustain life.

They quenched their **thirst** with spring water.

urge A strong restless desire.

He felt the **urge** to giggle.

The state of being poor and in need of essentials; poverty.

Victorian houses which are in **want** of repair.

wish A thing that is or has been wished for.

He makes a **wish**.

vearning A feeling of intense longing for something.

He felt a **yearning** for the mountains.

indigence A state of extreme poverty; destitution.

Their **indigence** appalled him.

Of a person having an insatiable appetite or desire for something

insatiable especially sex.

You re **insatiable** she cried as she pushed him away.

Having or showing a yearning desire.

longing Her longing eyes.

lupineAny plant of the genus Lupinus; bearing erect spikes of usually purplish-

blue flowers.

An act of quenching a very hot substance.

Firemen hauled on hoses in a desperate bid to **quench** the flames.

rapacious Excessively greedy and grasping.

The **rapacious** wolf.

Extremely hungry.

A ravenous boy.

slake Cause to heat and crumble by treatment with water.

Slake your thirst with citron press.

Force someone out of (a place) or into (a specified state) by starvation.

German U boats hoping to **starve** Britain into submission.

tantalize Harass with persistent criticism or carping.

She still **tantalize**d him.
