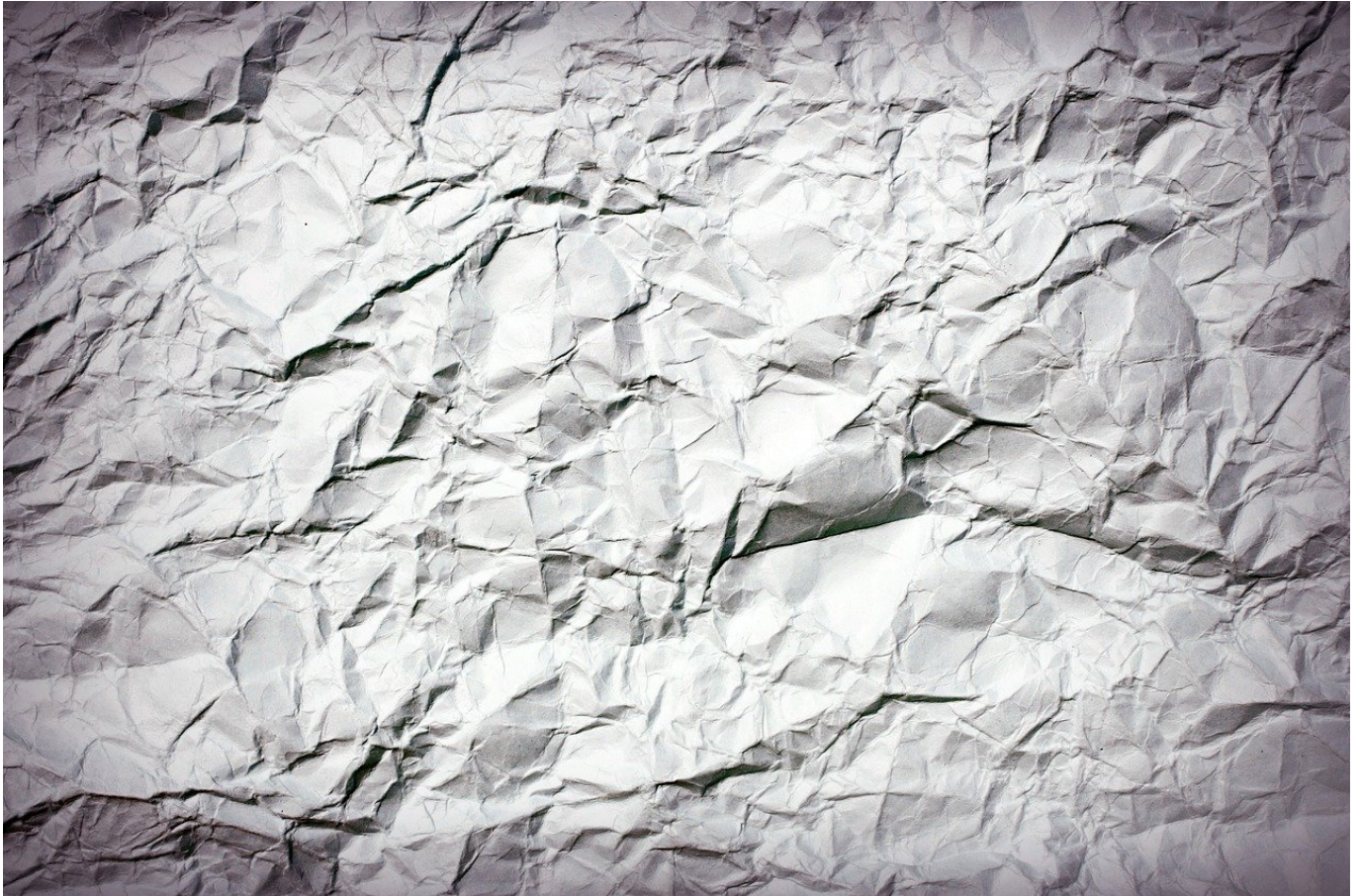
## Crease as a Noun

### Definitions of "Crease" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “crease” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Any of a number of lines marked on the pitch at specified places.*
- *An area around the goal in ice hockey or lacrosse which the players may not enter unless the puck or the ball has already done so.*
- *A wrinkle or furrow in the skin, especially of the face, caused by age or a particular facial expression.*
- *A slight depression or fold in the smoothness of a surface.*
- *A slight depression in the smoothness of a surface.*
- *A Malayan dagger with a wavy blade.*

- A line or ridge produced on paper or cloth by folding, pressing, or crushing.
- An angular or rounded shape made by folding.
- The position of a batsman during their innings.

<b>bend</b>	A kind of knot used to join two ropes together or to tie a rope to another object e g a carrick bend. <i>Make a <b>bend</b> in the wire.</i>
<b>corrugation</b>	A ridge on a corrugated surface.
<b>creese</b>	A Malayan dagger with a wavy blade.
<b>crimp</b>	A small connecting piece for crimping wires or lines together. <i>The <b>crimp</b> on take home pay has been even tighter since taxes were raised.</i>

<b>furrow</b>	A rut, groove, or trail in the ground or another surface. <i>Regular <b>furrows</b> in a ploughed field.</i>
<b>groove</b>	A long narrow furrow cut either by a natural process such as erosion or by a tool as e g a groove in a phonograph record. <i>His thoughts were slipping into a familiar <b>groove</b>.</i>
<b>kris</b>	A Malay or Indonesian dagger with a wavy-edged blade.
<b>laughter line</b>	The activity of laughing; the manifestation of joy or mirth or scorn.
<b>line</b>	Each of usually five horizontal lines forming a stave in musical notation. <i>His entire <b>lineage</b> has been warriors.</i>
<b>pleat</b>	A double or multiple fold in a garment or other item made of cloth, held by stitching the top or side.
<b>plication</b>	A fold or corrugation. <i>A <b>plication</b> on her blouse.</i>
<b>pucker</b>	A tightly gathered wrinkle or small fold. <i>A <b>pucker</b> between his eyebrows.</i>
<b>ridge</b>	A long narrow natural elevation on the floor of the ocean. <i>A path led through the <b>ridges</b> and furrows of fields long left to nature.</i>
<b>ruck</b>	A group of three players who follow the play without fixed positions. <i>Harry squeezed through the <b>ruck</b> to order another pint.</i>
<b>seam</b>	A slight depression in the smoothness of a surface. <i>The track cleaves a <b>seam</b> through corn.</i>
<b>tuck</b>	A narrow flattened pleat or fold that is stitched in place. <i>Lenzi nailed a reverse 3 1 2 somersault <b>tuck</b> on his final dive.</i>
<b>wrinkle</b>	A clever innovation, or useful piece of information or advice. <i>Learning the <b>wrinkles</b> from someone more experienced saves time.</i>

<b><u>enliven</u></b>	Make (something) more entertaining, interesting, or appealing. <i>The wartime routine was <b>enlivened</b> by a series of concerts.</i>
<b>entertain</b>	Provide entertainment for. <i><b>Entertain</b> interesting notions.</i>
<b><u>fold</u></b>	Confine in a fold like sheep. <i>The sofa <b>folds</b> out.</i>
<b><u>furrow</u></b>	Hollow out in the form of a furrow or groove. <i>His brows <b>furrowed</b> in concentration.</i>
<b><u>gather</u></b>	Collect or gather. <i>Information that we have <b>gathered</b> about people.</i>
<b>gladden</b>	Make glad. <i>The high childish laugh was a sound that <b>gladdened</b> her heart.</i>
<b>graze</b>	Scrape gently. <i>Shepherds who <b>grazed</b> animals on common land.</i>
<b>iron</b>	Press and smooth with a heated iron. <i>She stood there <b>ironing</b>.</i>
<b>line</b>	Mark with lines. <i>Trees <b>line</b> the riverbank.</i>

<b>please</b>	It is someone's choice to do something. <i>Instead of attending the meeting it <b>pleased</b> him to go off hunting.</i>
<b>press</b>	Press from a plastic. <i>I m terribly <b>pressed</b> for time.</i>
<b>pucker</b>	Draw together into folds or puckers. <i>Her lips <b>puckered</b>.</i>
<b>put a crease in</b>	Cause (someone) to undergo something.
<b>rake</b>	Draw together with a rake or similar implement. <i>In the early morning squads of workers <b>rake</b> the beach.</i>
<b>regale</b>	Entertain or amuse (someone) with talk. <i>He <b>regaled</b> her with a colourful account of that afternoon s meeting.</i>
<b>ruck up</b>	Raise.
<b>ruckle</b>	Make wrinkles or creases on a smooth surface; make a pressed, folded or wrinkled line in; `crisp' is archaic. <i>Start stitching from the same side or the fabric will pull and <b>ruckle</b> up on the front.</i>
<b>rumple</b>	Become wrinkled or crumpled or creased. <i>Careful you ll <b>rumple</b> my outfit.</i>
<b>scrunch</b>	Make wrinkles or creases on a smooth surface; make a pressed, folded or wrinkled line in. <i>Mist with water and <b>scrunch</b> into shape.</i>

<b>pleat</b>	Pleat or gather into a ruffle. <i>She was absently <b>pleating</b> her skirt between her fingers.</i>
<b>pucker</b>	Draw together into folds or puckers. <i>The baby stirred <b>puckering</b> up its face.</i>
<b><u>purse</u></b>	A sum of money spoken of as the contents of a money purse. <i>The <b>purse</b> barely covered the winner s expenses.</i>
<b><u>ripple</u></b>	A thing resembling a ripple or ripples in appearance or movement. <i>A <b>ripple</b> of laughter ran around the room.</i>
<b>ruffle</b>	Pleat or gather into a ruffle. <i>The bird <b>ruffled</b> its feathers.</i>

<b>skirt</b>	An edge, border, or extreme part. <i>He did not go through the city but <b>skirted</b> it.</i>
<b><u>stitch</u></b>	Make mend or join something with stitches. <i>Hand <b>stitched</b> dresses.</i>
<b>strut</b>	Brace something with a strut or struts. <i>A spindly framework of long slender <b>struts</b> girders and bracing wire.</i>
<b><u>tangle</u></b>	A twisted and tangled mass that is highly interwoven. <i>A <b>tangle</b> of government regulations.</i>
