- Anything living or existing.
- A fictional or imaginary being.
- A person of a specified kind.
- A living organism characterized by voluntary movement.
- An animal or person.
- An animal, as distinct from a human being.
- A human being; `wight' is an archaic term.

beast	A thing possessing a specified quality. Sex <b>beast</b> s who are assaulting victims.
beggar	A person of a specified type, especially one to be envied or pitied. <i>Poor little <b>beggar</b>s.</i>
<u>being</u>	Being alive living. Many factions remained in <b>being</b> .
brute	A living organism characterized by voluntary movement. A great <b>brute</b> of a machine.
character	A characteristic property that defines the apparent individual nature of something. To what do I owe this attack on my <b>character</b> .



The animals of a particular region, habitat, or geological period. <i>The flora and <b>fauna</b> of Siberia</i> .
An informal form of address for a man. He was elected a <b>fellow</b> of the American Physiological Association.
A person of unquestioning obedience.
A person who works only for money. The poorly paid <b>hireling</b> s in their shabby clothes.
A human being.
Any living or extinct member of the family Hominidae characterized by superior intelligence, articulate speech, and erect carriage.
A human being. Boat trips for parties and <b>individual</b> s.
A servant, especially a liveried footman or manservant. <i>Lackeys were waiting to help them from the carriage.</i>
A servile or fawning dependant. <i>He gets oppressed <b>minion</b>s like me to fob them off.</i>
A human being subject to death, as opposed to a divine being. An ambassador had to live in a style which was not expected of lesser <b>mortal</b> s.
A category used in the classification of pronouns possessive determiners and verb forms according to whether they indicate the speaker first person the addressee second person or a third party third person. <i>A weapon was hidden on his <b>person</b></i> .
A small figure of a person operated from above with strings by a puppeteer. <i>A former revolutionary hero who is now a <b>puppet</b> of the state.</i>
A servant, especially one who has worked for a person or family for a long time. <i>Faithful family <b>retainer</b>s.</i>
A person employed in the service of a government. A government <b>servant</b> .
The spiritual or immaterial part of a human being or animal, regarded as immortal. Brevity is the <b>soul</b> of wit.
An assistant subject to the authority or control of another. <i>He was mild mannered especially with his</i> <b>subordinate</b> s.
Anything used for emphasis. <i>He looks like he s wearing boxers underneath his trunks is that a <b>thing</b>.</i>



tool	A distinct design in the tooling of a book. Computers are an essential <b>tool</b> .
vassal	A person or country in a subordinate position to another. A <b>vassal</b> state of the Ottoman Empire.
wight	A human being wight is an archaic term. <i>He always was an unlucky <b>wight</b>.</i>
wretch	Someone you feel sorry for. <i>Can the poor <b>wretch</b> s corpse tell us anything.</i>

abide	(of a feeling or memory) continue without fading or being lost. <i>If there is one thing I cannot <b>abide</b> it is a lack of discipline.</i>
alive	Continuing in existence or use. Doctors are working hard to keep him <b>alive</b> .
archaeopteryx	Extinct primitive toothed bird of the Jurassic period having a long feathered tail and hollow bones; usually considered the most primitive of all birds.
<u>being</u>	Being alive living. A point of view gradually coming into <b>being</b> .
<b>biologically</b>	With respect to biology. The world s most <b>biologically</b> diverse ecosystems.



brute	A living organism characterized by voluntary movement. A great <b>brute</b> of a machine.
dweller	A person or animal that lives in or at a specified place. <i>City <b>dweller</b>s.</i>
existence	All that exists. The biggest tree in <b>existence</b> .
<u>existential</u>	Of or as conceived by existentialism. Formal logicians are not concerned with <b>existential</b> matters.
<u>extant</u>	Still in existence; surviving. <i>Extant</i> manuscripts.
fauna	All the animal life in a particular region or period. The flora and <b>fauna</b> of Siberia.
flagellate	A usually nonphotosynthetic free-living protozoan with whiplike appendages; some are pathogens of humans and other animals. <i>He <b>flagellate</b>d himself with branches.</i>
fungus	An organism of the kingdom Fungi lacking chlorophyll and feeding on organic matter; ranging from unicellular or multicellular organisms to spore-bearing syncytia. <i>Fallen logs were overgrown with bright</i> <b>fungus</b> .
genetically	By genetic mechanisms. Hair colour is <b>genetically</b> determined.
<u>habitat</u>	The natural home or environment of an animal, plant, or other organism. <i>A marine <b>habitat</b></i> .
humankind	Human beings considered collectively (used as a neutral alternative to 'mankind. <i>The origin of <b>humankind</b>.</i>
<u>incarnation</u>	The form taken by a person or thing during an incarnation. In a previous journalistic <b>incarnation</b> I worked at Westminster.
<u>inhabit</u>	Be an inhabitant of or reside in. Strange notions <b>inhabit</b> ed her mind.
life	An account of the series of events making up a person s life. She didn t want to die she loved <b>life</b> .
<u>lifelong</u>	Lasting or remaining in a particular state throughout a person's life. <i>The two men were to remain <b>lifelong</b> friends.</i>
<u>living</u>	Pertaining to living persons. What does he do for a <b>living</b> .



<u>organism</u>	The material structure of an organism. The Church is a divinely constituted <b>organism</b> .
outlive	Survive or last beyond (a specified period or expected lifespan. She <b>outlive</b> d her husband by many years.
phylum	(linguistics) a large group of languages that are historically related.
physiology	The branch of the biological sciences dealing with the functioning of organisms. <i>The <b>physiology</b> of the brain.</i>
<u>presence</u>	The act of being present. My <b>presence</b> in the flat made her happy.
protoplasm	The substance of a living cell (including cytoplasm and nucleus.
unicellular	(of an evolutionary or developmental stage) characterized by the formation or presence of a single cell or cells. <i>The <b>unicellular</b></i> precursors of arms and legs.
vertebrate	Denoting a vertebrate or relating to the vertebrates as a group.
zoology	The branch of biology that studies animals. The <b>zoology</b> of the Pliocene epoch.
