| <b>transaction</b>         | An instance of buying or selling something.<br><i>In an ordinary commercial <b>transaction</b> a delivery date is essential.</i>   |
| <b>trust</b>               | An arrangement whereby a person a trustee holds property as its nominal owner for the good of one or more beneficiaries.<br><i>I hurtled down the path <b>trusting</b> to luck that I wouldn't put a foot wrong.</i> |
