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Associations of "Credulity antonym" (30 Words)

alphabet	The basic elements in a system which combine to form complex entities. <i>The first letter of the alphabet.</i>
ascribe	Regard something as being due to (a cause). <i>Tough mindedness is a quality commonly ascribed to top bosses.</i>
concordance	Make a concordance of a text. <i>A concordance to the Bible.</i>
confidence	A secret or private matter told to someone under a condition of trust. <i>He had gained the young man s confidence.</i>
<u>derivative</u>	Originating from, based on, or influenced by. <i>Equity based derivative products.</i>
dictionary	A book or electronic resource that lists the words of a language (typically in alphabetical order) and gives their meaning, or gives the equivalent words in a different language, often also providing information about pronunciation, origin, and usage. <i>I ll look up love in the dictionary.</i>
diphthong	A digraph representing the sound of a diphthong or single vowel as in feat.
encyclopedia	A book or set of books giving information on many subjects or on many aspects of one subject and typically arranged alphabetically.
etymology	The origin of a word and the historical development of its meaning. <i>The etymology of the word devil.</i>
grammar	A grammar school. <i>The grammar of wine.</i>
grammarian	A person who studies and writes about grammar.
homonym	Two words are homonyms if they are pronounced or spelled the same way but have different meanings.
<u>indent</u>	The space left between the margin and the start of an indented line. <i>Type a paragraph of text and indent the first line.</i>

indentation	The action of indenting or the state of being indented. <i>Coastal indentations.</i>
lexicographer	A person who compiles dictionaries.
lexicography	The act of writing dictionaries. <i>Webster's name had become famous before he embarked on his career in lexicography.</i>
lexicon	A language user's knowledge of words. <i>A Greek Latin lexicon.</i>
orthography	The study of spelling and how letters combine to represent sounds and form words. <i>A spoken language which has as yet no sanctioned orthography.</i>
paragraph	Write about in a paragraph. <i>The information set out in paragraph 3.</i>
parse	Analyse (a string or text) into logical syntactic components. <i>A failed parse was retried.</i>
persuasion	A belief or set of beliefs, especially religious or political ones. <i>Monica needed plenty of persuasion before she actually left.</i>
pronunciation	The way in which a word is pronounced. <i>They are always correcting my pronunciation.</i>
reliable	A reliable person or thing. <i>The supporting cast includes old reliables like Mitchell.</i>
rhetoric	Language designed to have a persuasive or impressive effect, but which is often regarded as lacking in sincerity or meaningful content. <i>He is using a common figure of rhetoric hyperbole.</i>
sentence	Pronounce a sentence on somebody in a court of law. <i>He always spoke in grammatical sentences.</i>
spelling	A person's ability to spell words. <i>The books and spelling in my class were too simple.</i>
syntax	The branch of linguistics that deals with syntax. <i>Generative syntax.</i>
vocabulary	The body of words used in a particular language. <i>He had a wide vocabulary.</i>
vowel	A letter of the alphabet standing for a spoken vowel.
word	A word is a string of bits stored in computer memory. <i>In court it would have been his word against mine.</i>
