## Associations of "Creeps" (30 Words)

<b>apology</b>	A poor example. <i>He wrote a letter of <b>apology</b> to the hostess.</i>
<b>boggle</b>	Startle with amazement or fear. <i>This <b>boggles</b> the mind.</i>
<b><u>cower</u></b>	Crouch or curl up. <i>Children <b>cowered</b> in terror as the shoot out erupted.</i>
<b><u>crawl</u></b>	Swim by doing the crawl. <i>A <b>crawl</b> was all that the injured man could manage.</i>
<b><u>cringe</u></b>	Show submission or fear. <i>I <b>cringed</b> at the fellow s stupidity.</i>
<b>crouch</b>	A crouching stance or posture. <i>Leo was <b>crouched</b> before the fire.</i>
<b>duck</b>	The meat of a duck as food. <i>A tangy stew of <b>duck</b> lamb and sausage.</i>
<b><u>flinch</u></b>	An act of flinching. <i>She <b>flinched</b> when they showed the slaughtering of the calf.</i>
<b><u>furtive</u></b>	Marked by quiet and caution and secrecy; taking pains to avoid being observed. <i><b>Furtive</b> behavior.</i>
<b>grovel</b>	Lie or crawl abjectly on the ground with one’s face downwards. <i>He <b>grovelled</b> at George s feet.</i>
<b>huddle</b>	Confusion; bustle. <i>He controls the <b>huddle</b> and the team better than anybody else.</i>
<b><u>insidious</u></b>	Working or spreading in a hidden and usually injurious way. <i><b>Insidious</b> pleasures.</i>

<b>lurk</b>	(of an unpleasant quality) be present in a latent or barely discernible state, although still presenting a threat. <i>Danger <b>lurks</b> beneath the surface.</i>
<b>posture</b>	Assume a posture as for artistic purposes. <i>And still these two were <b>postured</b> motionless.</i>
<b>purloin</b>	Make off with belongings of others. <i>He must have managed to <b>purloin</b> a copy of the key.</i>
<b>rebound</b>	The act of securing possession of the rebounding basketball after a missed shot. <i><b>Rebound</b> hypertension.</i>
<b>recoil</b>	The action of recoiling. <i>His body jerked with the <b>recoil</b> of the rifle.</i>
<b>say</b>	Indicate. <i>The clock <b>says</b> noon.</i>
<b>secretly</b>	Not openly; inwardly. <i>Met <b>secretly</b> to discuss the invasion plans.</i>
<b>shrink</b>	A physician who specializes in psychiatry. <i>The metal is unsuitable for <b>shrinking</b> on to wooden staves.</i>
<b>silently</b>	Without speaking. <i>She sobbed <b>silently</b> in the corner.</i>
<b>sit</b>	Be or remain in a particular position or state. <i>Parliament continued <b>sitting</b> until March 16.</i>
<b>sneak</b>	Someone who prowls or sneaks about usually with unlawful intentions. <i><b>Sneak</b> a cigarette.</i>
<b>snitch</b>	Take by theft. <i>They thought he was a plant or a <b>snitch</b>.</i>
<b>squat</b>	An exercise in which a person squats down and rises again while holding a barbell across one's shoulders. <i>A <b>squatty</b> red smokestack.</i>
<b>stealthily</b>	In a cautious and surreptitious manner, so as not to be seen or heard. <i>We need to move <b>stealthily</b> and look inconspicuous.</i>
<b>stealthy</b>	Behaving or done in a cautious and surreptitious manner, so as not to be seen or heard. <i><b>Stealthy</b> footsteps.</i>
<b>step</b>	Set up a mast in its step. <i><b>Step</b> back.</i>

**surreptitious** Conducted with or marked by hidden aims or methods.  
A **surreptitious** glance at his watch.

**wince**

Make a face indicating disgust or dislike.  
He **winc**ed at the disgust in her voice.
