Associations of "Cried" (30 Words)

bawl	Make a raucous noise. <i>I sat on the couch and bawled my eyes out.</i>
bellow	United States author (born in Canada) whose novels influenced American literature after World War II (1915-2005). <i>A dozen large men were bellowing Jerusalem.</i>
complain	Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. <i>You never listen to me Larry complained.</i>
croon	A soft, low voice or tone. <i>Goodbye you lovely darling she crooned.</i>
elegy	A mournful poem; a lament for the dead.
gripe	Secure a boat with gripes. <i>Holidays make no difference to Simon Pat griped.</i>
growl	The sound of growling as made by animals. <i>Keep out of this he growled.</i>
holler	A loud cry or shout. <i>He hollered out to surrender our weapons.</i>
howl	Make a howling sound. <i>Howl with sorrow.</i>
howling	Filled with or characterized by howling. <i>Their howling had no effect.</i>
lament	A mournful poem a lament for the dead. <i>There were constant laments about the conditions of employment.</i>
lamentation	A cry of sorrow and grief. <i>Scenes of lamentation.</i>
plaintive	Sounding sad and mournful. <i>A plaintive cry.</i>

roar	A loud, deep sound uttered by a person or crowd, generally as an expression of pain, anger, or approval. <i>Her remarks brought a roar of laughter from the old man.</i>
screech	Make a high pitched screeching noise. <i>He ducked at the screechings of shells.</i>
shout	Prevent someone from speaking or being heard by shouting. <i>His words were interrupted by warning shouts.</i>
shriek	Sharp piercing cry. <i>The wheels shrieked as the car sped away.</i>
shrill	Utter a shrill cry. <i>Shrill criticism.</i>
sniffle	Cry or whine with snuffling. <i>She had a slight cough and a sniffle.</i>
snivel	An act or sound of snivelling. <i>Stop snivelling you got yourself into this mess.</i>
sob	An act or sound of sobbing. <i>He broke down and sobbed like a child.</i>
squawk	The noise of squawking. <i>With a startled squawk the rook flew off.</i>
squeak	Something achieved (or escaped) by a narrow margin. <i>The door opened with a slight squeak.</i>
squeal	Make a squeal. <i>She feared they would victimize her for squealing on their pals.</i>
wail	Utter a wail. <i>Wail in self pity.</i>
weep	A fit or period of weeping. <i>She rubbed the sore making it weep.</i>
whimper	A whimpering sound. <i>He s not dead is he she whimpered.</i>
whine	Give or make a long, high-pitched complaining cry or sound. <i>The whine of the engine.</i>
whinny	Of a horse make a whinny. <i>The pony whinnied and tossed his head happily.</i>
yell	A loud utterance of emotion (especially when inarticulate). <i>You don t have to yell I can hear you just fine.</i>
