## Associations of "Cried" (30 Words)

<b>bawl</b>	Make a raucous noise. <i>I sat on the couch and <b>bawled</b> my eyes out.</i>
<b>bellow</b>	United States author (born in Canada) whose novels influenced American literature after World War II (1915-2005). <i>A dozen large men were <b>bellowing</b> Jerusalem.</i>
<b>complain</b>	Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. <i>You never listen to me Larry <b>complained</b>.</i>
<b>croon</b>	A soft, low voice or tone. <i>Goodbye you lovely darling she <b>crooned</b>.</i>
<b>elegy</b>	A mournful poem; a lament for the dead.
<b>gripe</b>	Secure a boat with gripes. <i>Holidays make no difference to Simon Pat <b>griped</b>.</i>
<a href="#">growl</a>	The sound of growling as made by animals. <i>Keep out of this he <b>growled</b>.</i>
<b>holler</b>	A loud cry or shout. <i>He <b>hollered</b> out to surrender our weapons.</i>
<a href="#">howl</a>	Make a howling sound. <i><b>Howl</b> with sorrow.</i>
<b>howling</b>	Filled with or characterized by howling. <i>Their <b>howling</b> had no effect.</i>
<b>lament</b>	A mournful poem a lament for the dead. <i>There were constant <b>laments</b> about the conditions of employment.</i>
<b>lamentation</b>	A cry of sorrow and grief. <i>Scenes of <b>lamentation</b>.</i>
<a href="#">plaintive</a>	Sounding sad and mournful. <i>A <b>plaintive</b> cry.</i>

<b>roar</b>	A loud, deep sound uttered by a person or crowd, generally as an expression of pain, anger, or approval. <i>Her remarks brought a <b>roar</b> of laughter from the old man.</i>
<b>screech</b>	Make a high pitched screeching noise. <i>He ducked at the <b>screechings</b> of shells.</i>
<b>shout</b>	Prevent someone from speaking or being heard by shouting. <i>His words were interrupted by warning <b>shouts</b>.</i>
<b>shriek</b>	Sharp piercing cry. <i>The wheels <b>shrieked</b> as the car sped away.</i>
<b>shrill</b>	Utter a shrill cry. <i><b>Shrill</b> criticism.</i>
<b>sniffle</b>	Cry or whine with snuffling. <i>She had a slight cough and a <b>sniffle</b>.</i>
<b>snivel</b>	An act or sound of snivelling. <i>Stop <b>snivelling</b> you got yourself into this mess.</i>
<b>sob</b>	An act or sound of sobbing. <i>He broke down and <b>sobbed</b> like a child.</i>
<b>squawk</b>	The noise of squawking. <i>With a startled <b>squawk</b> the rook flew off.</i>
<b>squeak</b>	Something achieved (or escaped) by a narrow margin. <i>The door opened with a slight <b>squeak</b>.</i>
<b>squeal</b>	Make a squeal. <i>She feared they would victimize her for <b>squealing</b> on their pals.</i>
<b>wail</b>	Utter a wail. <i><b>Wail</b> in self pity.</i>
<b>weep</b>	A fit or period of weeping. <i>She rubbed the sore making it <b>weep</b>.</i>
<b>whimper</b>	A whimpering sound. <i>He s not dead is he she <b>whimpered</b>.</i>
<b>whine</b>	Give or make a long, high-pitched complaining cry or sound. <i>The <b>whine</b> of the engine.</i>
<b>whinny</b>	Of a horse make a whinny. <i>The pony whinnied and tossed his head happily.</i>
<b>yell</b>	A loud utterance of emotion (especially when inarticulate). <i>You don t have to <b>yell</b> I can hear you just fine.</i>
