Fill a shape or outline with colour.

Affect as in thought or feeling.

flush

Of a toilet be cleansed by flushing.
*A wave of colour **flushed** his cheeks.*

go pink

Be abolished or discarded.

go red

Go through in search of something; search through someone's belongings in an unauthorized way.

go scarlet

Pass from physical life and lose all bodily attributes and functions necessary to sustain life.

redden

(of the eyes) become pink at the rims as a result of crying.
*Lyn **reddened** at the description of herself.*

- reddish** Having a red tinge; slightly red.
*The leaves turn **reddish** brown.*
- rose red** Of something having a dusty purplish pink color.
- roseate** Used in names of birds with partly pink plumage e g roseate tern.
*The early **roseate** light.*
- ruby** Of a color at the end of the color spectrum (next to orange); resembling the color of blood or cherries or tomatoes or rubies.
- ruby-red** Of a color at the end of the color spectrum (next to orange); resembling the color of blood or cherries or tomatoes or rubies.
- ruddy** Used as a euphemism for 'bloody'.
*A cheerful pipe smoking man of **ruddy** complexion.*
- scarlet** Of a color at the end of the color spectrum (next to orange); resembling the color of blood or cherries or tomatoes or rubies.
*A mass of **scarlet** berries.*
- vermilion** Of a vivid red to reddish-orange color.
- violent** Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions inclined to react violently fervid.
*A **violent** confrontation with riot police.*

weal	Mark with a weal. <i>She slapped his cheek and a bright red weal sprang up on it.</i>
yellow	Used in names of moths or butterflies that are mainly yellow in colour. <i>Yellow press.</i>
