Definitions of "Crinkle" as a noun

- *A wrinkle or crease on the surface of something.*
- *A slight depression in the smoothness of a surface.*



Synonyms of "Crinkle" as a noun (13 Words)

corrugation	The act of shaping into parallel ridges and grooves.
<u>crease</u>	Any of a number of lines marked on the pitch at specified places. <i>A crease in his trousers.</i>
<u>crumple</u>	A crushed fold, crease, or wrinkle.
<u>fold</u>	A piece of paper or cloth that has been folded. <i>A fold of paper slipped out of the diary.</i>
<u>furrow</u>	A slight depression or fold in the smoothness of a surface. <i>There were deep furrows in his brow.</i>
<u>gather</u>	A part of a garment that is gathered.
groove	A long narrow furrow cut either by a natural process such as erosion or by a tool as e g a groove in a phonograph record. <i>His thoughts were slipping into a familiar groove.</i>
line	Space for one line of print one column wide and 1 14 inch deep used to measure advertising. <i>Each stanza has eight lines.</i>
pucker	A tightly gathered wrinkle or small fold. <i>A pucker between his eyebrows.</i>
<u>ridge</u>	A raised strip of arable land, especially (in medieval fields) one of a set separated by furrows. <i>A high pressure ridge helping to steer cyclones further south.</i>
rumple	An untidy state. <i>She left her clothes in a rumple on the floor.</i>
seam	A trace or presence of something. <i>The buried forests became seams of coal.</i>
wrinkle	A slight depression or fold in the smoothness of a surface. <i>Ironing gets rid of most wrinkles.</i>

- *There was a crinkle of suspicion on her forehead.*



Crinkle as a Verb

Definitions of "Crinkle" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "crinkle" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Become wrinkled or crumpled or creased.*
- *Make wrinkles or creases on a smooth surface; make a pressed, folded or wrinkled line in.*
- *Form into small surface creases or wrinkles.*
- *Make wrinkles or creases on a smooth surface; make a pressed, folded or wrinkled line in; 'crisp' is archaic.*



Synonyms of "Crinkle" as a verb (14 Words)

corrugate	Fold into ridges. <i>Micky s brow corrugated in a simian frown.</i>
crease	Make wrinkled or creased. <i>Jo could imitate anybody and always made him crease up.</i>
crimp	Curl tightly. <i>Crimp hair.</i>
crisp	Of food develop a crisp surface in an oven or under a grill. <i>There is a cooling breeze which crisps the broad clear river.</i>
crumple	Become wrinkled or crumpled or creased. <i>The child s face crumpled and he began to howl.</i>
furrow	Hollow out in the form of a furrow or groove. <i>Furrow one s brow.</i>
line	Mark with lines. <i>Line a chimney.</i>
pucker	Draw together into folds or puckers. <i>She puckered her lips.</i>
ruck up	Raise.
ruckle	Make wrinkles or creases on a smooth surface; make a pressed, folded or wrinkled line in; `crisp' is archaic. <i>In the hall the rugs were ruckled up as if someone had been in a hurry to get out.</i>
rumple	Become wrinkled or crumpled or creased. <i>Careful you ll rumple my outfit.</i>
scrunch	Make a noise typical of an engine lacking lubricants. <i>Their faces scrunch up with concentration.</i>
scrunch up	Raise.
wrinkle	Gather or contract into wrinkles or folds pucker. <i>He sniffed and wrinkled his nose.</i>



Usage Examples of "Crinkle" as a verb

- *He smiled boyishly, crinkling his eyes.*
- *Rose's face crinkled in bewilderment.*
