### **Definitions of "Crinkle" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “crinkle” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A slight depression or fold in the smoothness of a surface.*
- *A wrinkle or crease on the surface of something.*
- *A slight depression in the smoothness of a surface.*



## Synonyms of "Crinkle" as a noun (13 Words)

<b>corrugation</b>	The act of shaping into parallel ridges and grooves.
<b>crease</b>	Any of a number of lines marked on the pitch at specified places. <i>A <b>crease</b> in his trousers.</i>
<b>crumple</b>	A crushed fold, crease, or wrinkle.
<b>fold</b>	A piece of paper or cloth that has been folded. <i>A <b>fold</b> of paper slipped out of the diary.</i>
<b>furrow</b>	A slight depression or fold in the smoothness of a surface. <i>There were deep <b>furrows</b> in his brow.</i>
<b>gather</b>	A part of a garment that is gathered.
<b>groove</b>	A long narrow furrow cut either by a natural process such as erosion or by a tool as e g a groove in a phonograph record. <i>His thoughts were slipping into a familiar <b>groove</b>.</i>
<b>line</b>	Space for one line of print one column wide and 1 14 inch deep used to measure advertising. <i>Each stanza has eight <b>lines</b>.</i>
<b>pucker</b>	A tightly gathered wrinkle or small fold. <i>A <b>pucker</b> between his eyebrows.</i>
<b>ridge</b>	A raised strip of arable land, especially (in medieval fields) one of a set separated by furrows. <i>A high pressure <b>ridge</b> helping to steer cyclones further south.</i>
<b>rumple</b>	An untidy state. <i>She left her clothes in a <b>rumple</b> on the floor.</i>
<b>seam</b>	A trace or presence of something. <i>The buried forests became <b>seams</b> of coal.</i>
<b>wrinkle</b>	A slight depression or fold in the smoothness of a surface. <i>Ironing gets rid of most <b>wrinkles</b>.</i>



### **Usage Examples of "Crinkle" as a noun**

- *There was a crinkle of suspicion on her forehead.*



## Crinkle as a Verb

### Definitions of "Crinkle" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "crinkle" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Become wrinkled or crumpled or creased.*
- *Make wrinkles or creases on a smooth surface; make a pressed, folded or wrinkled line in.*
- *Form into small surface creases or wrinkles.*
- *Make wrinkles or creases on a smooth surface; make a pressed, folded or wrinkled line in; `crisp' is archaic.*



## Synonyms of "Crinkle" as a verb (14 Words)

<b>corrugate</b>	Fold into ridges. <i>Micky s brow <b>corrugated</b> in a simian frown.</i>
<b>crease</b>	Make wrinkled or creased. <i>Jo could imitate anybody and always made him <b>crease</b> up.</i>
<b>crimp</b>	Curl tightly. <i><b>Crimp</b> hair.</i>
<b>crisp</b>	Of food develop a crisp surface in an oven or under a grill. <i>There is a cooling breeze which <b>crisps</b> the broad clear river.</i>
<b>crumple</b>	Become wrinkled or crumpled or creased. <i>The child s face <b>crumpled</b> and he began to howl.</i>
<b>furrow</b>	Hollow out in the form of a furrow or groove. <i><b>Furrow</b> one s brow.</i>
<b>line</b>	Mark with lines. <i><b>Line</b> a chimney.</i>
<b>pucker</b>	Draw together into folds or puckers. <i>She <b>puckered</b> her lips.</i>
<b>ruck up</b>	Raise.
<b>ruckle</b>	Make wrinkles or creases on a smooth surface; make a pressed, folded or wrinkled line in; `crisp' is archaic. <i>In the hall the rugs were <b>ruckled</b> up as if someone had been in a hurry to get out.</i>
<b>rumple</b>	Become wrinkled or crumpled or creased. <i>Careful you ll <b>rumple</b> my outfit.</i>
<b>scrunch</b>	Make a noise typical of an engine lacking lubricants. <i>Their faces <b>scrunch</b> up with concentration.</i>
<b>scrunch up</b>	Raise.
<b>wrinkle</b>	Gather or contract into wrinkles or folds pucker. <i>He sniffed and <b>wrinkled</b> his nose.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Crinkle" as a verb

- *He smiled boyishly, crinkling his eyes.*
- *Rose's face crinkled in bewilderment.*
