- *An intersection of two or more roads.*
- *A crisis situation or point in time when a critical decision must be made.*
- *A junction where one street or road crosses another.*

<b>climacteric</b>	The period of life when fertility and sexual activity are in decline; (in women) menopause. <i>Ripening accompanied by a sharp rise in respiration the so called <b>climacteric</b>.</i>
<b>crossing</b>	The action of crossing something. <i>The <b>crossing</b> of the Pennines.</i>
<b>crux</b>	A particular point of difficulty. <i>Herein lies the <b>crux</b> of the issue.</i>
<b>culmination</b>	A final climactic stage. <i>Their achievements stand as a <b>culmination</b> of centuries of development.</i>
<b>gyratory</b>	A road junction or traffic system requiring the circular movement of traffic, larger or more complex than an ordinary roundabout.
<b>hamlet</b>	A community of people smaller than a village.

<b>head</b>	The head regarded as the location of intellect imagination and memory. <i>His horse won by a <b>head</b>.</i>
<b><u>height</u></b>	Elevation especially above sea level or above the earth's surface. <i>He s terrified of <b>heights</b>.</i>
<b>interchange</b>	A road junction designed on several levels so that traffic streams do not intersect. <i>I listened in shock to this venomous <b>interchange</b>.</i>
<b><u>intersection</u></b>	A point or set of points common to two or more geometric configurations. <i>The <b>intersection</b> of a plane and a cone.</i>
<b>junction</b>	The set of features in speech that enable a hearer to detect a word or phrase boundary (e.g. distinguishing I scream from ice cream). <i>The plane crashed at the <b>junction</b> of two mountains.</i>
<b>moment of truth</b>	The n-th moment of a distribution is the expected value of the n-th power of the deviations from a fixed value.
<b>point of no return</b>	A brief version of the essential meaning of something.
<b>rubicon</b>	A line that when crossed permits of no return and typically results in irrevocable commitment.
<b>turning point</b>	A circular segment of a curve.
<b>zero hour</b>	The sight setting that will cause a projectile to hit the center of the target with no wind blowing.

- avenue** A broad road in a town or city, typically having trees at regular intervals along its sides.  
*Three possible **avenues** of research suggested themselves.*
- boulevard** A wide street in a town or city, typically one lined with trees.  
*Sunset **Boulevard**.*
- busy** Unavailable for use by anyone else or indicating unavailability engaged is a British term for a busy telephone line.  
*He had been too **busy** to enjoy himself.*
- convergent** Relating to or denoting evolutionary convergence.  
*A **convergent** boundary.*

<b>crisscross</b>	Mark with a pattern of crossing lines. <i>Wrinkles <b>crisscrossed</b> her face.</i>
<b>cross</b>	Travel across or pass over. <i>Our letters <b>crossed</b>.</i>
<b>crossing</b>	The action of crossing something. <i>The <b>crossing</b> of the Pennines.</i>
<b>crossover</b>	The process of achieving success in a different field or style, especially in popular music. <i>A jazz classical <b>crossover</b> album.</i>
<b>crosswalk</b>	A path (often marked) where something (as a street or railroad) can be crossed to get from one side to the other.
<b>delineation</b>	Representation by drawing or painting etc. <i>The eventual <b>delineation</b> of the border between the two states.</i>
<b>drawbridge</b>	A bridge that can be raised to block passage or to allow boats or ships to pass beneath it. <i>There was a rattle of chains as the <b>drawbridge</b> was lowered.</i>
<b>fordable</b>	Shallow enough to be crossed by walking or riding on an animal or in a vehicle. <i>The stream was <b>fordable</b>.</i>
<b>intersect</b>	(of two or more things) pass or lie across each other. <i>Lines of latitude and longitude <b>intersect</b> at right angles.</i>
<b>intersection</b>	A junction where one street or road crosses another. <i>The set of red hats is the <b>intersection</b> of the set of hats and the set of red things.</i>
<b>jaywalk</b>	Cross or walk in the street or road unlawfully or without regard for approaching traffic. <i>You <b>jaywalked</b> across a busy four lane street.</i>
<b>junction</b>	A region of transition in a semiconductor between a part where conduction is mainly by electrons and a part where it is mainly by holes. <i>The <b>junction</b> of the two rivers.</i>
<b>lamppost</b>	A metal post supporting an outdoor lamp (such as a streetlight).
<b>lineation</b>	A contour or outline. <i>Magnetic <b>lineations</b>.</i>
<b>overlap</b>	A part or amount which overlaps. <i>Two new series <b>overlapped</b>.</i>
<b>partially</b>	Only in part; to a limited extent. <i>The work <b>partially</b> fulfills the function of a historical memoir.</i>

<b>pavement</b>	Walk consisting of a paved area for pedestrians; usually beside a street or roadway. <i>A <b>pavement</b> cafe.</i>
<b>pedestrian</b>	A person walking rather than travelling in a vehicle. <i>A <b>pedestrian</b> movie plot.</i>
<b>road</b>	The part of a road intended for vehicles especially in contrast to a verge or pavement. <i>The <b>road</b> to fame.</i>
<b>roadway</b>	The part of a road intended for vehicles, in contrast to the pavement or verge.
<b>route</b>	Send via a specific route. <i>Proposals have been put forward for a new <b>route</b> around the south of the town.</i>
<b>sidewalk</b>	A paved path for pedestrians at the side of a road; a pavement.
<b>street</b>	People living or working on the same street. <i>London <b>street</b> style.</i>
<b>superimpose</b>	Place or lay (one thing) over another, typically so that both are still evident. <i>Can you <b>superimpose</b> the two images.</i>
<b>walker</b>	A person who travels by foot. <i>A fell <b>walker</b>.</i>
