## Crucible as a Noun

### Definitions of "Crucible" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “crucible” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A situation of severe trial, or in which different elements interact, leading to the creation of something new.*
- *A vessel made of material that does not melt easily; used for high temperature chemical reactions.*
- *A ceramic or metal container in which metals or other substances may be melted or subjected to very high temperatures.*



## Synonyms of "Crucible" as a noun (5 Words)

### container

A discrete environment set up within an operating system in which one or more applications may be run, typically assigned only those resources necessary for the application to function correctly.

*A **container** ship.*

**cooking utensil** The act of preparing something (as food) by the application of heat.

**melting pot** The process whereby heat changes something from a solid to a liquid.

**receptacle** An organ or structure which receives a secretion, eggs, sperm, etc.  
*Fast food **receptacles**.*

### vessel

(chiefly in biblical use) a person regarded as having or embodying a particular quality.

*Lord use this lowly **vessel** let me serve You as You will.*



## Usage Examples of "Crucible" as a noun

- *The crucible tipped and the mould filled with liquid metal.*

- *Their relationship was forged in the crucible of war.*



## Associations of "Crucible" (30 Words)

- bin** Store something especially wine in a bin.  
*She was a bit weird so I **binned** her off.*
- box** The quantity contained in a box.  
*A cigarette **box**.*
- can** Preserve in a can or tin.  
*Where **can** she have gone.*
- cement** Concrete pavement is sometimes referred to as cement.  
*The original quartz grains were **cemented** by authigenic quartz.*

<b><u>container</u></b>	An object for holding or transporting something. <i>More <b>containers</b> can run on a server than traditional virtual machines.</i>
<b>crossbeam</b>	A horizontal beam that extends across something.
<b>dross</b>	The scum formed by oxidation at the surface of molten metals. <i>Alchemists tried to create gold from <b>dross</b>.</i>
<b>funnel</b>	Move or pour through a funnel. <i>A <b>funnel</b> of light fell from a circular ceiling.</i>
<b>furnace</b>	An appliance fired by gas or oil in which air or water is heated to be circulated throughout a building in a heating system. <i>Her car was a <b>furnace</b>.</i>
<b>girder</b>	A beam made usually of steel; a main support in a structure. <i>The tower is made of steel <b>girders</b> criss crossed to make it stronger.</i>
<b><u>grit</u></b>	Cover with a grit. <i>I ve known few men who could match Maude s <b>grit</b>.</i>
<b><u>harden</u></b>	Cause to accept or become hardened to habituate. <i>This served only to <b>harden</b> the resolve of the island nations.</i>
<b>iron</b>	Press and smooth with a heated iron. <i>His long <b>irons</b> were majestic.</i>
<b>landfill</b>	An area filled in by landfill. <i><b>Landfill</b> sites.</i>
<b>lid</b>	An eyelid. <i>He raised the piano <b>lid</b>.</i>
<b>lime</b>	Any of various related trees bearing limes. <i><b>Lime</b> the lawn.</i>
<b>molding</b>	Sculpture produced by molding.
<b>mortar</b>	Attack or bombard with a mortar. <i>A pestle and <b>mortar</b>.</i>
<b>nickel</b>	Plate with nickel. <i>It s far easier to copper an article than to <b>nickel</b> it.</i>
<b><u>package</u></b>	A package holiday. <i>A <b>package</b> of measures announced by the government.</i>
<b><u>plastic</u></b>	Made of plastic. <i>Bottles can be made from a variety of <b>plastics</b>.</i>
<b>salver</b>	A tray (or large plate) for serving food or drinks; usually made of silver.
<b>smelt</b>	Extract a metal from ore by smelting. <i>Coal was used to <b>smelt</b> the steel for the tinplate.</i>

- steel** Knife sharpener consisting of a ridged steel rod.  
*Nerves of **steel**.*
- stoke** Encourage or incite (a strong emotion or tendency).  
*He **stoked** up the barbecue.*
- tin** Preserve in a can or tin.  
***Tinned** foods are not very tasty.*
- tinplate** Sheet steel or iron coated with tin.
- trash** An amphetamine derivative (trade name Methedrine) used in the form of a crystalline hydrochloride; used as a stimulant to the nervous system and as an appetite suppressant.  
***Trash** these old chairs.*
- wooden** Made of wood.  
*A **wooden** smile.*
