Draw together into folds or puckers. pucker The baby stirred **pucker**ing up its face.

A thing resembling a ripple or ripples in appearance or movement. <u>ripple</u>

He dived into the pool leaving barely a **ripple**.

Pleat or gather into a ruffle. ruffle

They warbled incessantly their throat feathers **ruffle**d.

Become wrinkled or crumpled or creased. rumple

Careful you ll **rumple** my outfit.

Sew the seam of or join with a seam. seam The track cleaves a **seam** through corn.

The act of forcibly dispossessing an owner of property.

seizure He suffered an epileptic **seizure**.

Decrease in size, range, or extent. shrivel

The flowers simply **shrivel**led up.

Go round or past the edge of. skirt

She **skirt**ed the problem.

Make mend or join something with stitches. stitch

Basic embroidery **stitch**es.

Brace something with a strut or struts. strut

Peacocks **strut** through the grounds.

Cause to topple or tumble by pushing. topple

She **topple**d over when I touched her.



tuck Make a tuck or several folds in.

A tummy tuck.

tumble Cause to topple or tumble by pushing.

Not a soul gave him a **tumble**.

undulate (especially of a leaf) having a wavy surface or edge.

The landscape rolled and **undulate**d for miles in every direction.

wizened Lean and wrinkled by shrinkage as from age or illness.

A wizened little man with frizzy grey hair.

Make wrinkles or creases on a smooth surface make a pressed folded or

wrinkle wrinkled line in crisp is archaic.

The organizers have the wrinkles pretty well ironed out.
