Definitions of "Crumpled" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “crumpled” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Crushed to form creases and wrinkles.*
- *(of a person) collapsed on the ground.*
- *Of metal e.g.*



Synonyms of "Crumpled" as an adjective (2 Words)

bent Used of the back and knees; stooped.
*A missionary **bent** on saving souls.*

dented Of metal e.g.
***Dented** fenders.*



Usage Examples of "Crumpled" as an adjective

- *I fell to the floor in a crumpled heap.*
- *A car with a crumpled front end.*
- *A crumpled sheet.*

- apoplectic** Overcome with anger; furious.
*An **apoplectic** attack.*
- bend** Bend one's back forward from the waist on down.
***Bend** the rod.*
- clothes** Bedclothes.
*A **clothes** shop.*
- collapse** Cause a lung or blood vessel to collapse.
*The three of them **collapsed** with laughter.*
- crease** Become wrinkled or crumpled or creased.
*A bullet **creased** his thigh.*
- crumble** A pudding made with crumble and fruit.
*Apple **crumble**.*
- flop** With a flopping sound.
*Liz **flopped** down into the armchair.*

fray	(of a fabric, rope, or cord) unravel or become worn at the edge, typically through constant rubbing. <i>As the temperature rose tempers frayed.</i>
garment	Provide with clothes or put clothes on. <i>Garments of the finest silk.</i>
hem	Fold over and sew together to provide with a hem. <i>Let down the hem.</i>
line	Mark or cover with lines. <i>Lines of communication were set up between the two firms.</i>
messy	Generating or involving mess. <i>Stripping wallpaper can be a messy time consuming job.</i>
pleat	Fold into pleats. <i>She was absently pleating her skirt between her fingers.</i>
pucker	Draw together into folds or puckers. <i>The baby stirred puckering up its face.</i>
purse	A sum of money spoken of as the contents of a money purse. <i>Under stress his lips would purse slightly.</i>
ripple	A thing resembling a ripple or ripples in appearance or movement. <i>He dived into the pool leaving barely a ripple.</i>
ruffle	Pleat or gather into a ruffle. <i>They warbled incessantly their throat feathers ruffled.</i>
rumple	Become wrinkled or crumpled or creased. <i>Careful you ll rumple my outfit.</i>
seam	Sew the seam of or join with a seam. <i>The track cleaves a seam through corn.</i>
seizure	The act of forcibly dispossessing an owner of property. <i>He suffered an epileptic seizure.</i>
shrivel	Decrease in size, range, or extent. <i>The flowers simply shrivelled up.</i>
skirt	Go round or past the edge of. <i>She skirted the problem.</i>
stitch	Make mend or join something with stitches. <i>Basic embroidery stitches.</i>
strut	Brace something with a strut or struts. <i>Peacocks strut through the grounds.</i>
topple	Cause to topple or tumble by pushing. <i>She toppled over when I touched her.</i>

- tuck** Make a tuck or several folds in.
*A tummy **tuck**.*
- tumble** Cause to topple or tumble by pushing.
*Not a soul gave him a **tumble**.*
- undulate** (especially of a leaf) having a wavy surface or edge.
*The landscape rolled and **undulated** for miles in every direction.*
- wizened** Lean and wrinkled by shrinkage as from age or illness.
*A **wizened** little man with frizzy grey hair.*
- wrinkle** Make wrinkles or creases on a smooth surface make a pressed folded or wrinkled line in crisp is archaic.
*The organizers have the **wrinkles** pretty well ironed out.*
