## **Crushed as an Adjective**

### **Definitions of "Crushed" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “crushed” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Deformed, pulverized, or forced inwards by compression.*
- *(of cloth or paper) creased or crumpled.*
- *Subdued or brought low in condition or status.*
- *Treated so as to have a permanently wrinkled appearance.*
- *Feeling overwhelmingly disappointed or embarrassed.*



### Synonyms of "Crushed" as an adjective (4 Words)

- broken** Out of working order busted is an informal substitute for broken.  
***Broken*** lines of defense.
- humbled** Marked by meekness or modesty; not arrogant or prideful- B.K.Malinowski.
- humiliated** Made to feel uncomfortable because of shame or wounded pride.  
***Humiliated*** that his wife had to go out to work.
- low** Of a vowel pronounced with the tongue held low in the mouth open.  
***Low*** ceilings.



## Usage Examples of "Crushed" as an adjective

- *Crushed trousers and a crumpled jacket.*
- *Crushed velvet.*
- *I was crushed—was I not good enough?*



## Associations of "Crushed" (30 Words)

- abrade**      Wear away.  
*It was a landscape slowly **abraded** by a fine stinging dust.*
- ax**            Chop or split with an ax.  
***Axe** wood.*
- breaker**      A heavy sea wave that breaks into white foam on the shore.  
*A rule **breaker**.*
- bust**          A sculpture of a person's head, shoulders, and chest.  
*He **busted** my radio.*

<b>chop</b>	Form or shape by chopping. <i>The boat headed into the <b>chop</b>.</i>
<b>clash</b>	Meet and come into violent conflict. <i>A <b>clash</b> of tweeds and a striped shirt.</i>
<b>compaction</b>	The exertion of force on something so that it becomes more dense. <i>An ice core formed by <b>compaction</b> of previous snowfalls constitutes a historical record of the local climate.</i>
<b>compression</b>	The action of compressing or being compressed.
<b>crash</b>	Move with or as if with a crashing noise. <i>The test pilot <b>crashed</b> a Hurricane fighter plane.</i>
<b>crumble</b>	A pudding made with crumble and fruit. <i>Apple <b>crumble</b>.</i>
<b>drudgery</b>	Hard monotonous routine work. <i>Domestic <b>drudgery</b>.</i>
<b>fist</b>	Clench the hand or fingers into a fist. <i>She pummelled him furiously with her <b>fists</b>.</i>
<b>flatten</b>	Lower (a note) in pitch by a semitone. <i>The landscape <b>flattened</b>.</i>
<b>flour</b>	Cover with flour. <i>Manioc <b>flour</b>.</i>
<b>grind</b>	Make a grating or grinding sound by rubbing together. <i>Only the right <b>grind</b> gives you all the fine flavour.</i>
<b>grindstone</b>	A thick disc of stone or other abrasive material mounted so as to revolve, used for grinding, sharpening, or polishing metal objects.
<b>hammering</b>	The action or sound of hammering something. <i>A 7 0 <b>hammering</b> by the league leaders.</i>
<b>hone</b>	Sharpen with a hone. <i>I started to <b>hone</b> in on the problem.</i>
<b>mash</b>	A mixture of mashed malt grains and hot water used in brewing. <i>A bucket of <b>mash</b>.</i>
<b>mill</b>	Grind with a mill. <i>A <b>mill</b> town.</i>
<b>millstone</b>	Something that hinders or handicaps.
<b>powder</b>	Gunpowder. <i>Crush the poppy seeds to a <b>powder</b>.</i>
<b>pulverize</b>	Destroy completely. <i>The brick of the villages was <b>pulverized</b> by the bombardment.</i>

- sharpen** Improve or cause to improve.  
*The debate **sharpened**.*
- shatter** Break into many pieces.  
*The news of her husband s death **shattered** her life.*
- shred** Reduce documents to unreadable strips by feeding them into a shredder.  
*Executives have **shredded** key documents.*
- smash** An act or sound of something smashing.  
*The death of her son **smashed** her.*
- squash** Edible fruit of a squash plant eaten as a vegetable.  
*A **squash** club.*
- squeeze** A twisting squeeze.  
*I cocked the gun and **squeezed** the trigger.*
- tamp** A tool for tamping e g for tamping tobacco into a pipe bowl or a charge into a drill hole etc.  
***Tamp** the coffee grinds in the container to make espresso.*
