- Subdued or brought low in condition or status.
- Treated so as to have a permanently wrinkled appearance.
- Feeling overwhelmingly disappointed or embarrassed.

humbled Marked by meekness or modesty; not arrogant or prideful- B.K.Malinowski.


Made to feel uncomfortable because of shame or wounded pride.

grindstone A thick disc of stone or other abrasive material mounted so as to revolve,

used for grinding, sharpening, or polishing metal objects.

hone Sharpen with a hone.
