- *A piece of a homogeneous solid substance having a natural geometrically regular form with symmetrically arranged plane faces.*
- *A clear transparent mineral, especially quartz.*
- *A rock formed by the solidification of a substance; has regularly repeating internal structure; external plane faces.*
- *Glassware made of quartz.*
- *Articles made of crystal glass.*

- *Highly transparent glass with a high refractive index.*
- *Colorless glass made of almost pure silica.*

crystalware	Ornaments and articles made from crystal glass. <i>The finalists all received bouquets and crystalware.</i>
glassware	An article of tableware made of glass.
lechatelierite	Colorless glass made of almost pure silica.
quartz	A hard glossy mineral consisting of silicon dioxide in crystal form present in most rocks especially sandstone and granite yellow sand is quartz with iron oxide impurities.
quartz glass	Colorless glass made of almost pure silica.

watch crystal A small portable timepiece.

watch glass The period during which someone (especially a guard) is on duty.

alabaster	Like alabaster in whiteness and smoothness. <i>Her alabaster cheeks flushed with warmth.</i>
amethyst	Of a moderate purple color. <i>Amethyst earrings.</i>
auriferous	(of rocks or minerals) containing gold. <i>Auriferous quartz veins.</i>
calcite	A white or colourless mineral consisting of calcium carbonate. It is a major constituent of sedimentary rocks such as limestone and is deposited in caves to form stalactites and stalagmites.
calcium	The chemical element of atomic number 20, a soft grey metal.
<u>cement</u>	Concrete pavement is sometimes referred to as cement. <i>The two firms are expected to cement an agreement soon.</i>

cryogenic	Relating to or involving the branch of physics that deals with the production and effects of very low temperatures. <i>A powerful cryogenic engine.</i>
crystallize	Assume crystalline form become crystallized. <i>The sale may not crystallize the charge.</i>
freeze	Cause to freeze. <i>A nuclear freeze.</i>
frost	The formation of frost or ice on a surface. <i>It is not unusual for buds to be nipped by frost.</i>
glacier	A slowly moving mass of ice.
granite	Something having the quality of granite unyielding firmness. <i>Granite columns.</i>
icicle	Ice resembling a pendent spear, formed by the freezing of dripping water.
jadeite	A green, blue, or white mineral which is one of the forms of jade. It is a silicate of sodium, aluminium, and iron and belongs to the pyroxene group.
jewelry	An adornment (as a bracelet or ring or necklace) made of precious metals and set with gems (or imitation gems).
limestone	A sedimentary rock consisting mainly of calcium that was deposited by the remains of marine animals.
marble	A sculpture carved from marble. <i>A couple of girls were playing marbles.</i>
mineral	Relating to minerals. <i>A wide range of necessary vitamins and minerals.</i>
nephrite	A hard, pale green or white mineral which is one of the forms of jade. It is a silicate of calcium and magnesium.
phial	A small cylindrical glass bottle, typically used for medical samples or for potions or medicines. <i>A phial of blood.</i>
porphyry	Any igneous rock with crystals embedded in a finer groundmass of minerals.
quartz	A hard glossy mineral consisting of silicon dioxide in crystal form present in most rocks especially sandstone and granite yellow sand is quartz with iron oxide impurities.
refrigerant	Causing cooling or freezing. <i>A refrigerant substance such as ice or solid carbon dioxide.</i>
refrigerate	Subject (food or drink) to cold in order to chill or preserve it, typically by placing it in a refrigerator. <i>Refrigerate this medicine.</i>

rhinestone	An imitation diamond, used in cheap jewellery and to decorate clothes. <i>Rhinestone earrings.</i>
rock	A large piece of rock which has become detached from a cliff or mountain a boulder. <i>The police discovered six ounces of rock in his van.</i>
silicon	The chemical element of atomic number 14 a non metal with semiconducting properties used in making electronic circuits Pure silicon exists in a shiny dark grey crystalline form and as an amorphous powder.
snow	Falls of snow. <i>The first snows of winter.</i>
snowflake	A crystal of snow. <i>These little snowflakes will soon discover that life doesn't come with trigger warnings.</i>
<u>solidify</u>	Make solid or more solid cause to solidify. <i>Social and political pressures helped to solidify national identities.</i>
