- Select from a large quantity; obtain from a variety of sources.
- Send (an inferior or surplus farm animal) to be slaughtered.
- Reduce the population of (a wild animal) by selective slaughter.
- Look for and gather.
- Pick (flowers or fruit.

excision The act of pulling up or out; uprooting; cutting off from existence.

The **excision** of the carcinoma.

Eradicate or destroy completely.

extirpate Timber wolves were **extirpate**d from New England more than a century

ago.

extirpation Surgical removal of a body part or tissue.

Destroy utterly; wipe out.

obliterate The special stamp should be placed on the left hand side and not be used to
