<b>agrarian</b>	A person who advocates a redistribution of landed property. <i>The <b>agrarian</b> reforms.</i>
<b>agricultural</b>	Relating to rural matters. <i>An <b>agricultural</b> worker.</i>
<b>agriculture</b>	The class of people engaged in growing food.
<b>arable</b>	Of crops able to be grown on arable land. <i><b>Arable</b> farming.</i>
<a href="#"><b>barn</b></a>	A large farm building used for storing grain, hay, or straw or for housing livestock. <i>A great <b>barn</b> of a pub.</i>
<b>civilize</b>	Raise from a barbaric to a civilized state. <i>Both countries feel they have a mission to <b>civilize</b> the world.</i>
<b>corn</b>	Ears of corn that can be prepared and served for human food. <i><b>Corned</b> beef.</i>
<b>countryside</b>	The inhabitants of countryside areas. <i><b>Countryside</b> conservation groups.</i>
<a href="#"><b>crop</b></a>	Prepare for crops. <i>The southern areas are <b>cropped</b> in cotton.</i>
<b>cultivation</b>	Socialization through training and education to develop one’s mind or manners. <i>The <b>cultivation</b> of bees for honey.</i>
<b>cultivator</b>	Someone concerned with the science or art or business of cultivating the soil. <i>Rotary <b>cultivators</b> are ideal in the kitchen garden.</i>
<b>diligently</b>	With diligence; in a diligent manner. <i>I searched <b>diligently</b> for a remedy.</i>

<b>farm</b>	Workplace consisting of farm buildings and cultivated land as a unit. <i>An energy <b>farm</b>.</i>
<b>farmhouse</b>	House for a farmer and family. <i>A <b>farmhouse</b> kitchen.</i>
<b>farming</b>	Relating to farming or agriculture. <i>Land was enclosed for arable <b>farming</b>.</i>
<b>farmland</b>	A rural area where farming is practiced.
<b>harvest</b>	Gather a crop as a harvest. <i>They gathered a <b>harvest</b> of examples.</i>
<b>husbandry</b>	The practice of cultivating the land or raising stock. <i>All aspects of animal <b>husbandry</b>.</i>
<b>maize</b>	A Central American cereal plant that yields large grains (corn or sweetcorn) set in rows on a cob. The many varieties include some used for stockfeed and corn oil.
<b>pea</b>	Seed of a pea plant used for food. <i>Steak and ale pie with <b>peas</b> and new potatoes.</i>
<b>plantation</b>	Garden consisting of a small cultivated wood without undergrowth. <i>New conifer <b>plantations</b>.</i>
<b>potato</b>	The plant of the nightshade family which produces potatoes on underground runners. <i>Mashed <b>potato</b>.</i>
<b>produce</b>	Administer the financial and managerial aspects of (a film or broadcast) or the staging of (a play, opera, etc). <i>These chemicals <b>produce</b> a noxious vapor.</i>
<b>production</b>	The provision of something for consideration, inspection, or use. <i>The car is no longer in <b>production</b>.</i>
<b>sty</b>	Keep a pig in a sty. <i>The place is a real <b>sty</b> beer and wine bottles all over the place.</i>
<b>till</b>	A strongbox for holding cash. <i><b>Till</b> the soil.</i>
<b>uncultivated</b>	(of persons) lacking art or knowledge. <i><b>Uncultivated</b> land.</i>
<b>vine</b>	A climbing or trailing woody stemmed plant related to the grapevine. <i>The hip got their <b>vines</b> at Wolmuth s on Market Street.</i>
<b>wheat</b>	Grains of common wheat sometimes cooked whole or cracked as cereal usually ground into flour.
