agrarian	A person who advocates a redistribution of landed property. <i>The agrarian reforms.</i>
agricultural	Relating to rural matters. <i>An agricultural worker.</i>
agriculture	The class of people engaged in growing food.
arable	Of crops able to be grown on arable land. <i>Arable farming.</i>
barn	A large farm building used for storing grain, hay, or straw or for housing livestock. <i>A great barn of a pub.</i>
civilize	Raise from a barbaric to a civilized state. <i>Both countries feel they have a mission to civilize the world.</i>
corn	Ears of corn that can be prepared and served for human food. <i>Corned beef.</i>
countryside	The inhabitants of countryside areas. <i>Countryside conservation groups.</i>
crop	Prepare for crops. <i>The southern areas are cropped in cotton.</i>
cultivation	Socialization through training and education to develop one’s mind or manners. <i>The cultivation of bees for honey.</i>
cultivator	Someone concerned with the science or art or business of cultivating the soil. <i>Rotary cultivators are ideal in the kitchen garden.</i>
diligently	With diligence; in a diligent manner. <i>I searched diligently for a remedy.</i>

farm	Workplace consisting of farm buildings and cultivated land as a unit. <i>An energy farm.</i>
farmhouse	House for a farmer and family. <i>A farmhouse kitchen.</i>
farming	Relating to farming or agriculture. <i>Land was enclosed for arable farming.</i>
farmland	A rural area where farming is practiced.
harvest	Gather a crop as a harvest. <i>They gathered a harvest of examples.</i>
husbandry	The practice of cultivating the land or raising stock. <i>All aspects of animal husbandry.</i>
maize	A Central American cereal plant that yields large grains (corn or sweetcorn) set in rows on a cob. The many varieties include some used for stockfeed and corn oil.
pea	Seed of a pea plant used for food. <i>Steak and ale pie with peas and new potatoes.</i>
plantation	Garden consisting of a small cultivated wood without undergrowth. <i>New conifer plantations.</i>
potato	The plant of the nightshade family which produces potatoes on underground runners. <i>Mashed potato.</i>
produce	Administer the financial and managerial aspects of (a film or broadcast) or the staging of (a play, opera, etc). <i>These chemicals produce a noxious vapor.</i>
production	The provision of something for consideration, inspection, or use. <i>The car is no longer in production.</i>
sty	Keep a pig in a sty. <i>The place is a real sty beer and wine bottles all over the place.</i>
till	A strongbox for holding cash. <i>Till the soil.</i>
uncultivated	(of persons) lacking art or knowledge. <i>Uncultivated land.</i>
vine	A climbing or trailing woody stemmed plant related to the grapevine. <i>The hip got their vines at Wolmuth s on Market Street.</i>
wheat	Grains of common wheat sometimes cooked whole or cracked as cereal usually ground into flour.
