bottle	A bottle fitted with a teat for giving milk or other drinks to babies and very young children. <i>She managed to get through a bottle of wine.</i>
carafe	An open-topped glass flask used for serving wine or water in a restaurant. <i>A carafe of retsina.</i>
ceramic	The material from which ceramics are made. <i>Tableware in ceramic.</i>
chinaware	Dishware made of high quality porcelain.
coffee	A cup of coffee. <i>A cup of coffee.</i>
crockery	Plates, dishes, cups, and other similar items, especially ones made of earthenware or china.
dish	The quantity that a dish will hold. <i>This tool accurately checks for proper dishing of a wheel.</i>
earthen	Relating to or characteristic of the earth or material existence. <i>The earthen world is but an imperfect mirror of the heavens.</i>
earthenware	Ceramic ware made of porous clay fired at low heat. <i>An earthenware jug.</i>
ewer	A large jug with a wide mouth, formerly used for carrying water.
figurine	A small carved or molded figure.
gourd	A climbing or trailing plant which bears gourds.
jar	The quantity contained in a jar. <i>This play jarred the audience.</i>
kiln	A furnace or oven for burning, baking, or drying, especially one for calcining lime or firing pottery.

<u>mug</u>	The human face kisser and smiler and mug are informal terms for face and phiz is British. <i>He mugged for the camera.</i>
pitcher	Botany a leaf that that is modified in such a way as to resemble a pitcher or ewer. <i>A pitcher of water.</i>
porcelain	An article made of porcelain. <i>A porcelain bowl.</i>
pottery	The craft or profession of making pottery. <i>A visit to a Staffordshire pottery.</i>
saucer	A small shallow dish for holding a cup at the table.
scurry	A flurry of rain or snow. <i>I was in such a scurry.</i>
silverware	Dishes, containers, or cutlery made of or coated with silver, or made of a material resembling silver.
statuette	A small carved or molded figure.
stein	Experimental expatriate United States writer (1874-1946).
tableware	Crockery, cutlery, and glassware used for serving and eating meals at a table.
tumbler	A glass with a flat bottom but no handle or stem; originally had a round bottom.
urn	An ornamental sculpture shaped like an urn. <i>A tea urn.</i>
utensil	An implement for practical use (especially in a household). <i>Kitchen utensils.</i>
<u>vase</u>	A decorative container without handles, typically made of glass or china and used as an ornament or for displaying cut flowers.
vitriify	Undergo vitrification; become glassy or glass-like. <i>The option of vitriifying nuclear waste presents problems.</i>
