exposure	The disclosure of something secret. The <b>exposure</b> of his anger was shocking.
medium of exchange	Gaining (or losing) a rook in return for a knight or bishop.
money	Wealth reckoned in terms of money. We tried to collect the <b>money</b> he owed us.
notes	A characteristic emotional quality.
paper money	The physical object that is the product of a newspaper publisher.
<u>prevalence</u>	A superiority in numbers or amount. The <b>prevalence</b> of obesity in adults.
<u>publicity</u>	The quality of being open to public view. A <b>publicity</b> campaign.
up-to-dateness	The property of belonging to the present time.

anna	A former monetary unit of India and Pakistan, equal to one sixteenth of a rupee.
buck	Of a horse to perform a buck. The boat began to <b>buck</b> in the water.
budget	Allow or provide a particular amount of money in a budget. <i>Keep within the household <b>budget</b></i> .
cent	Used for emphasis to denote no money at all. <i>He was paid 40 cents an hour.</i>
<u>charge</u>	File a formal charge against. <i>Charge</i> all weapons shields and banners.
<u>coin</u>	Money in the form of coins. <i>Coin phrases or words.</i>
coinage	The invention of a new word or phrase. The volume of <b>coinage</b> in circulation.



commemorative	Intended as a commemoration. A commemorative plaque.
devaluation	The reduction or underestimation of the worth or importance of something. The general <b>devaluation</b> of expertise in our culture.
dime	Street name for a packet of illegal drugs that is sold for ten dollars. <i>He didn t have a <b>dime</b></i> .
dollar	A piece of paper money worth one dollar. <i>He worships the almighty <b>dollar</b>.</i>
drachma	A unit of apothecary weight equal to an eighth of an ounce or to 60 grains.
exchange	Exchange contracts. <i>Exchange</i> prisoners.
guinea	A former British gold coin that was first minted in 1663 from gold imported from West Africa, with a value that was later fixed at 21 shillings. It was replaced by the sovereign from 1817.
<u>inflation</u>	A general and progressive increase in prices. <i>High <b>inflation</b> rates.</i>
monetary	Relating to money or currency. Documents with little or no <b>monetary</b> value.
neologism	A newly invented word or phrase.
neology	The act of inventing a word or phrase.
nickel	Coat with nickel. A button the size of a <b>nickel</b> .
nickelodeon	A cabinet containing an automatic record player; records are played by inserting a coin.
overvalue	Overestimate the importance of. Sterling was <b>overvalue</b> d against the dollar.
penny	(in biblical use) a denarius. We didn t get paid a <b>penny</b> .
price	Discover or establish the price of something for sale. They say that every politician has a <b>price</b> .
<u>purse</u>	A sum of money spoken of as the contents of a money purse. <i>He and his wife shared a common <b>purse</b>.</i>
rates	A local tax on property (usually used in the plural.
specie	Money in the form of coins rather than notes. The Bank of England in 1795 had held around 8 million in <b>specie</b> .



stagflation	A period of slow economic growth and high unemployment (stagnation) while prices rise (inflation.
sterling	British money especially the pound sterling as the basic monetary unit of the UK. A <b>sterling</b> spoon.
<u>token</u>	Insignificantly small a matter of form only tokenish is informal. I wanted to offer you a small <b>token</b> of my appreciation.
von	The basic unit of monoy in Japan, equal to 100 son
