- *A system of money in general use in a particular country.*



Synonyms of "Currency" as a noun (15 Words)

banknotes

A piece of paper money (especially one issued by a central bank).

cash

Money in coins or notes, as distinct from cheques, money orders, or credit.

*A discount for **cash**.*

circulation

Free movement or passage (as of cytoplasm within a cell or sap through a plant).

*Ocean **circulation** is an important part of global climate.*

| dissemination | The property of being diffused or dispersed. <i>The dissemination of public information.</i> |
| exposure | The disclosure of something secret. <i>The exposure of his anger was shocking.</i> |
| medium of exchange | Gaining (or losing) a rook in return for a knight or bishop. |
| money | Wealth reckoned in terms of money. <i>We tried to collect the money he owed us.</i> |
| notes | A characteristic emotional quality. |
| paper money | The physical object that is the product of a newspaper publisher. |
| prevalence | A superiority in numbers or amount. <i>The prevalence of obesity in adults.</i> |
| publicity | The quality of being open to public view. <i>A publicity campaign.</i> |
| up-to-dateness | The property of belonging to the present time. |

| cent | Used for emphasis to denote no money at all. <i>He was paid 40 cents an hour.</i> |
| <u>charge</u> | File a formal charge against. Charge all weapons shields and banners. |
| <u>coin</u> | Money in the form of coins. Coin phrases or words. |
| coinage | The invention of a new word or phrase. <i>The volume of coinage in circulation.</i> |

| commemorative | Intended as a commemoration. A commemorative plaque. |
| devaluation | The reduction or underestimation of the worth or importance of something. <i>The general devaluation of expertise in our culture.</i> |
| dime | Street name for a packet of illegal drugs that is sold for ten dollars. <i>He didn't have a dime.</i> |
| dollar | A piece of paper money worth one dollar. <i>He worships the almighty dollar.</i> |
| drachma | A unit of apothecary weight equal to an eighth of an ounce or to 60 grains. |
| exchange | Exchange contracts. Exchange prisoners. |
| guinea | A former British gold coin that was first minted in 1663 from gold imported from West Africa, with a value that was later fixed at 21 shillings. It was replaced by the sovereign from 1817. |
| <u>inflation</u> | A general and progressive increase in prices. <i>High inflation rates.</i> |
| monetary | Relating to money or currency. <i>Documents with little or no monetary value.</i> |
| neologism | A newly invented word or phrase. |
| neology | The act of inventing a word or phrase. |
| nickel | Coat with nickel. <i>A button the size of a nickel.</i> |
| nickelodeon | A cabinet containing an automatic record player; records are played by inserting a coin. |
| overvalue | Overestimate the importance of. <i>Sterling was overvalued against the dollar.</i> |
| penny | (in biblical use) a denarius. <i>We didn't get paid a penny.</i> |
| price | Discover or establish the price of something for sale. <i>They say that every politician has a price.</i> |
| <u>purse</u> | A sum of money spoken of as the contents of a money purse. <i>He and his wife shared a common purse.</i> |
| rates | A local tax on property (usually used in the plural). |
| specie | Money in the form of coins rather than notes. <i>The Bank of England in 1795 had held around 8 million in specie.</i> |

- stagflation** A period of slow economic growth and high unemployment (stagnation) while prices rise (inflation).
- sterling** British money especially the pound sterling as the basic monetary unit of the UK.
A **sterling** spoon.
- token** Insignificantly small a matter of form only tokenish is informal.
*I wanted to offer you a small **token** of my appreciation.*
- yen** The basic unit of money in Japan; equal to 100 sen.
