### Definitions of "Currency" as a noun

- *The property of belonging to the present time.*
- *The time during which something is in use or operation.*
- *The fact or quality of being generally accepted or in use.*
- *General acceptance or use.*
- *The metal or paper medium of exchange that is presently used.*
- *A system of money in general use in a particular country.*



## Synonyms of "Currency" as a noun (15 Words)

### banknotes

A piece of paper money (especially one issued by a central bank).

### cash

Money in coins or notes, as distinct from cheques, money orders, or credit.

*A discount for **cash**.*

### circulation

Free movement or passage (as of cytoplasm within a cell or sap through a plant).

*Ocean **circulation** is an important part of global climate.*

<b>coinage</b>	A newly invented word or phrase. <i>Decimal <b>coinage</b>.</i>
<b>coins</b>	A flat metal piece (usually a disc) used as money.
<b>currentness</b>	A flow of electricity through a conductor.
<b>dissemination</b>	The property of being diffused or dispersed. <i>The <b>dissemination</b> of public information.</i>
<b>exposure</b>	The disclosure of something secret. <i>The <b>exposure</b> of his anger was shocking.</i>
<b>medium of exchange</b>	Gaining (or losing) a rook in return for a knight or bishop.
<b>money</b>	Wealth reckoned in terms of money. <i>We tried to collect the <b>money</b> he owed us.</i>
<b>notes</b>	A characteristic emotional quality.
<b>paper money</b>	The physical object that is the product of a newspaper publisher.
<b>prevalence</b>	A superiority in numbers or amount. <i>The <b>prevalence</b> of obesity in adults.</i>
<b>publicity</b>	The quality of being open to public view. <i>A <b>publicity</b> campaign.</i>
<b>up-to-dateness</b>	The property of belonging to the present time.



## Usage Examples of "Currency" as a noun

- *No claim had been made during the currency of the policy.*
- *The currency of ideas.*
- *The term gained wider currency after the turn of the century.*
- *The dollar was a strong currency.*

## Associations of "Currency" (30 Words)

<b>anna</b>	A former monetary unit of India and Pakistan, equal to one sixteenth of a rupee.
<b>buck</b>	Of a horse to perform a buck. <i>The boat began to <b>buck</b> in the water.</i>
<b>budget</b>	Allow or provide a particular amount of money in a budget. <i>Keep within the household <b>budget</b>.</i>
<b>cent</b>	Used for emphasis to denote no money at all. <i>He was paid 40 <b>cents</b> an hour.</i>
<u><a href="#">charge</a></u>	File a formal charge against. <i><b>Charge</b> all weapons shields and banners.</i>
<u><a href="#">coin</a></u>	Money in the form of coins. <i><b>Coin</b> phrases or words.</i>
<b>coinage</b>	The invention of a new word or phrase. <i>The volume of <b>coinage</b> in circulation.</i>

<b>commemorative</b>	Intended as a commemoration. <i>A <b>commemorative</b> plaque.</i>
<b>devaluation</b>	The reduction or underestimation of the worth or importance of something. <i>The general <b>devaluation</b> of expertise in our culture.</i>
<b>dime</b>	Street name for a packet of illegal drugs that is sold for ten dollars. <i>He didn't have a <b>dime</b>.</i>
<b>dollar</b>	A piece of paper money worth one dollar. <i>He worships the almighty <b>dollar</b>.</i>
<b>drachma</b>	A unit of apothecary weight equal to an eighth of an ounce or to 60 grains.
<b>exchange</b>	Exchange contracts. <i><b>Exchange</b> prisoners.</i>
<b>guinea</b>	A former British gold coin that was first minted in 1663 from gold imported from West Africa, with a value that was later fixed at 21 shillings. It was replaced by the sovereign from 1817.
<a href="#"><u>inflation</u></a>	A general and progressive increase in prices. <i>High <b>inflation</b> rates.</i>
<b>monetary</b>	Relating to money or currency. <i>Documents with little or no <b>monetary</b> value.</i>
<b>neologism</b>	A newly invented word or phrase.
<b>neology</b>	The act of inventing a word or phrase.
<b>nickel</b>	Coat with nickel. <i>A button the size of a <b>nickel</b>.</i>
<b>nickelodeon</b>	A cabinet containing an automatic record player; records are played by inserting a coin.
<b>overvalue</b>	Overestimate the importance of. <i>Sterling was <b>overvalued</b> against the dollar.</i>
<b>penny</b>	(in biblical use) a denarius. <i>We didn't get paid a <b>penny</b>.</i>
<b>price</b>	Discover or establish the price of something for sale. <i>They say that every politician has a <b>price</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>purse</u></a>	A sum of money spoken of as the contents of a money purse. <i>He and his wife shared a common <b>purse</b>.</i>
<b>rates</b>	A local tax on property (usually used in the plural).
<b>specie</b>	Money in the form of coins rather than notes. <i>The Bank of England in 1795 had held around 8 million in <b>specie</b>.</i>

## stagflation

A period of slow economic growth and high unemployment (stagnation) while prices rise (inflation).

## sterling

British money especially the pound sterling as the basic monetary unit of the UK.

A **sterling** spoon.

## token

Insignificantly small a matter of form only tokenish is informal.

*I wanted to offer you a small **token** of my appreciation.*

## yen

The basic unit of money in Japan; equal to 100 sen.
