under a curse Located below or beneath something else.


unredeemed Not redeemed.

Unredeemed human nature alienated from God.

unsaved In danger of the eternal punishment of Hell.

You have the option of recovering **unsaved** changes after a crash.





Usage Examples of "Cursed" as an adjective

- $\bullet \ His \ cursed \ stupidity.$
- Villagers shun the area believing it to be cursed.
- His cursed tidy-mindedness.
- Cursed with four daughter.
- Not a cursed drop.

accursed Under a curse.

The Angel of Death walks this **accursed** house.

Curse or declare to be evil or anathema or threaten with divine

anathematize punishment.

He **anathematize**d them as bloody scroungers.

benedict A newly married man (especially one who has long been a bachelor.

billingsgate Foul-mouthed or obscene abuse.

blamed Expletives used informally as intensifiers.

It s a **blamed** shame.

blaspheme Speak irreverently about God or sacred things.

He has **blaspheme**d against the Holy Spirit.

<u>bless</u> favour upon; ask God to look favourably on.

We have been **bless**ed with a beautiful baby boy.

consecrate Give entirely to a specific person, activity, or cause.

The present Holy Trinity church was **consecrate**d in 1845.

curse Invoke or use a curse against.

The bad witch **curse**d the child.

detestation A detested person or thing.

Wordsworth s **detestation** of aristocracy.

devil Fighting spirit; wildness.

Devilled eggs.

diabolical Characteristic of the Devil, or so evil as to be suggestive of the Devil.

A singer with an absolutely **diabolical** voice.

evil Of a force or spirit embodying or associated with the forces of the devil.

His struggle against the forces of **evil**.

ghost Haunt like a ghost pursue.

The building is haunted by the **ghost** of a monk.

hellish Extremely difficult or unpleasant.

Hellish weather.

holy Belonging to or derived from or associated with a divine power.

I do not lead a **holy** life.

horrible Causing or likely to cause horror; shocking.

War is beyond all words horrible.

imprecation A slanderous accusation.

I pushed my way through screaming imprecations.

infernal Irritating and tiresome (used for emphasis.

Infernal regions.

loathing A feeling of intense dislike or disgust; hatred.

The thought filled him with **loathing**.

A magical word or phrase uttered with the intention of bringing about evil;

malediction a curse.

He muttered **malediction**s to himself as he trod the stone passages.

revile Spread negative information about.

He was now **revile**d by the party that he had helped to lead.

Devoted exclusively to a single use or purpose or person.

The **sacred** mosque.



Render holy by means of religious rites.

May God **sanctify** his soul.

The quality of being holy.

The **sanctity** of human life.

scary Provoking fear terror.

A scary movie.

An offensive word used especially to express anger a swear word.

swear Griffin made contact with the coach which led to him yelling a **swear** back

in his direction.

terrible Very unwell or troubled.

The **terrible** conditions in which the ordinary people lived.

Dedicate to a deity by a vow.

Never again he **vow**ed.
