### **Definitions of "Cursed" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “cursed” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Deserving a curse; sometimes used as an intensifier.*
- *Used to express annoyance or irritation.*
- *In danger of the eternal punishment of Hell.*



## Synonyms of "Cursed" as an adjective (8 Words)

<b>curst</b>	Deserving a curse; sometimes used as an intensifier.
<b>doomed</b>	Marked by or promising bad fortune. <i>The black spot told the old sailor he was <b>doomed</b>.</i>
<b>ill-fated</b>	Marked by or promising bad fortune- W.H.Prescott.
<b>ill-starred</b>	Marked by or promising bad fortune- W.H.Prescott.
<b>under a curse</b>	Located below or beneath something else.
<b>unredeemed</b>	Not redeemed. <i><b>Unredeemed</b> human nature alienated from God.</i>
<b>unsaved</b>	In danger of the eternal punishment of Hell. <i>You have the option of recovering <b>unsaved</b> changes after a crash.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Cursed" as an adjective

- *I'll be cursed if I can see your reasoning.*
- *His cursed stupidity.*
- *Villagers shun the area believing it to be cursed.*
- *His cursed tidy-mindedness.*
- *Cursed with four daughter.*
- *Not a cursed drop.*





## Associations of "Cursed" (30 Words)

- accursed** Under a curse.  
*The Angel of Death walks this **accursed** house.*
- anathematize** Curse or declare to be evil or anathema or threaten with divine punishment.  
*He **anathematized** them as bloody scroungers.*
- benedict** A newly married man (especially one who has long been a bachelor).
- billingsgate** Foul-mouthed or obscene abuse.
- blamed** Expletives used informally as intensifiers.  
*It s a **blamed** shame.*
- blaspheme** Speak irreverently about God or sacred things.  
*He has **blasphemed** against the Holy Spirit.*

<b>bless</b>	Pronounce words in a religious rite in order to confer or invoke divine favour upon; ask God to look favourably on. <i>We have been <b>blessed</b> with a beautiful baby boy.</i>
<b>consecrate</b>	Give entirely to a specific person, activity, or cause. <i>The present Holy Trinity church was <b>consecrated</b> in 1845.</i>
<b>curse</b>	Invoke or use a curse against. <i>The bad witch <b>curse</b>d the child.</i>
<b>detestation</b>	A detested person or thing. <i>Wordsworth s <b>detestation</b> of aristocracy.</i>
<b>devil</b>	Fighting spirit; wildness. <i><b>Devilled</b> eggs.</i>
<b>diabolical</b>	Characteristic of the Devil, or so evil as to be suggestive of the Devil. <i>A singer with an absolutely <b>diabolical</b> voice.</i>
<b>evil</b>	Of a force or spirit embodying or associated with the forces of the devil. <i>His struggle against the forces of <b>evil</b>.</i>
<b>ghost</b>	Haunt like a ghost pursue. <i>The building is haunted by the <b>ghost</b> of a monk.</i>
<b>hellish</b>	Extremely difficult or unpleasant. <i><b>Hellish</b> weather.</i>
<b>holy</b>	Belonging to or derived from or associated with a divine power. <i>I do not lead a <b>holy</b> life.</i>
<b>horrible</b>	Causing or likely to cause horror; shocking. <i>War is beyond all words <b>horrible</b>.</i>
<b>imprecation</b>	A slanderous accusation. <i>I pushed my way through screaming <b>imprecations</b>.</i>
<b>infernal</b>	Irritating and tiresome (used for emphasis). <i><b>Infernal</b> regions.</i>
<b>loathing</b>	A feeling of intense dislike or disgust; hatred. <i>The thought filled him with <b>loathing</b>.</i>
<b>malediction</b>	A magical word or phrase uttered with the intention of bringing about evil; a curse. <i>He muttered <b>maledictions</b> to himself as he trod the stone passages.</i>
<b>revile</b>	Spread negative information about. <i>He was now <b>reviled</b> by the party that he had helped to lead.</i>
<b>sacred</b>	Devoted exclusively to a single use or purpose or person. <i>The <b>sacred</b> mosque.</i>

<b>sanctify</b>	Render holy by means of religious rites. <i>May God <b>sanctify</b> his soul.</i>
<b>sanctity</b>	The quality of being holy. <i>The <b>sanctity</b> of human life.</i>
<b>scary</b>	Provoking fear terror. <i>A <b>scary</b> movie.</i>
<b>swear</b>	An offensive word used especially to express anger a swear word. <i>Griffin made contact with the coach which led to him yelling a <b>swear</b> back in his direction.</i>
<b>terrible</b>	Very unwell or troubled. <i>The <b>terrible</b> conditions in which the ordinary people lived.</i>
<b>vow</b>	Dedicate to a deity by a vow. <i>Never again he <b>vowed</b>.</i>
