Definitions of "Cursed" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “cursed” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Deserving a curse; sometimes used as an intensifier.*
- *Used to express annoyance or irritation.*
- *In danger of the eternal punishment of Hell.*



Synonyms of "Cursed" as an adjective (8 Words)

curst	Deserving a curse; sometimes used as an intensifier.
doomed	Marked by or promising bad fortune. <i>The black spot told the old sailor he was doomed.</i>
ill-fated	Marked by or promising bad fortune- W.H.Prescott.
ill-starred	Marked by or promising bad fortune- W.H.Prescott.
under a curse	Located below or beneath something else.
unredeemed	Not redeemed. <i>Unredeemed human nature alienated from God.</i>
unsaved	In danger of the eternal punishment of Hell. <i>You have the option of recovering unsaved changes after a crash.</i>



Usage Examples of "Cursed" as an adjective

- *I'll be cursed if I can see your reasoning.*
- *His cursed stupidity.*
- *Villagers shun the area believing it to be cursed.*
- *His cursed tidy-mindedness.*
- *Cursed with four daughter.*
- *Not a cursed drop.*



Associations of "Cursed" (30 Words)

accursed	Under a curse. <i>The Angel of Death walks this accursed house.</i>
anathematize	Curse or declare to be evil or anathema or threaten with divine punishment. <i>He anathematized them as bloody scroungers.</i>
benedict	A newly married man (especially one who has long been a bachelor.
billingsgate	Foul-mouthed or obscene abuse.
blamed	Expletives used informally as intensifiers. <i>It s a blamed shame.</i>
blaspheme	Speak irreverently about God or sacred things. <i>He has blasphemed against the Holy Spirit.</i>

<u>bless</u>	Pronounce words in a religious rite in order to confer or invoke divine favour upon; ask God to look favourably on. <i>We have been blessed with a beautiful baby boy.</i>
consecrate	Give entirely to a specific person, activity, or cause. <i>The present Holy Trinity church was consecrated in 1845.</i>
curse	Invoke or use a curse against. <i>The bad witch cursed the child.</i>
detestation	A detested person or thing. <i>Wordsworth s detestation of aristocracy.</i>
devil	Fighting spirit; wildness. <i>Devilled eggs.</i>
<u>diabolical</u>	Characteristic of the Devil, or so evil as to be suggestive of the Devil. <i>A singer with an absolutely diabolical voice.</i>
evil	Of a force or spirit embodying or associated with the forces of the devil. <i>His struggle against the forces of evil.</i>
<u>ghost</u>	Haunt like a ghost pursue. <i>The building is haunted by the ghost of a monk.</i>
<u>hellish</u>	Extremely difficult or unpleasant. <i>Hellish weather.</i>
holy	Belonging to or derived from or associated with a divine power. <i>I do not lead a holy life.</i>
horrible	Causing or likely to cause horror; shocking. <i>War is beyond all words horrible.</i>
imprecation	A slanderous accusation. <i>I pushed my way through screaming imprecations.</i>
infernal	Irritating and tiresome (used for emphasis). <i>Infernal regions.</i>
loathing	A feeling of intense dislike or disgust; hatred. <i>The thought filled him with loathing.</i>
malediction	A magical word or phrase uttered with the intention of bringing about evil; a curse. <i>He muttered maledictions to himself as he trod the stone passages.</i>
revile	Spread negative information about. <i>He was now reviled by the party that he had helped to lead.</i>
sacred	Devoted exclusively to a single use or purpose or person. <i>The sacred mosque.</i>

sanctify

Render holy by means of religious rites.
*May God **sanctify** his soul.*

sanctity

The quality of being holy.
*The **sanctity** of human life.*

scary

Provoking fear terror.
*A **scary** movie.*

swear

An offensive word used especially to express anger a swear word.
*Griffin made contact with the coach which led to him yelling a **swear** back in his direction.*

terrible

Very unwell or troubled.
*The **terrible** conditions in which the ordinary people lived.*

vow

Dedicate to a deity by a vow.
*Never again he **vowed**.*
