Custodian as a Noun

Definitions of "Custodian" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “custodian” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A goalkeeper or wicketkeeper.*
- *A person employed to clean and maintain a building.*
- *A person who has responsibility for taking care of or protecting something.*
- *One having charge of buildings or grounds or animals.*

Synonyms of "Custodian" as a noun (7 Words)

conservator	The custodian of a collection (as a museum or library). <i>A paper conservator.</i>
<u>curator</u>	A keeper or custodian of a museum or other collection. <i>The curator of drawings at the National Gallery.</i>
<u>guardian</u>	The superior of a Franciscan convent. <i>Self appointed guardians of public morality.</i>
keeper	A ring worn to keep a more valuable one on the finger. <i>This disc is a keeper and one that belongs on every serious DVD collector's shelf.</i>

<u>overseer</u>	A person who directs and manages an organization.
steward	A person responsible for supplies of food to a college, club, or other institution. <i>Farmers pride themselves on being stewards of the countryside.</i>
superintendent	A person who manages or superintends an organization or activity. <i>Superintendent of district nurses.</i>

Usage Examples of "Custodian" as a noun

- *The custodians of pension and insurance funds.*
- *The custodian of the Great Seal in Canada is always the Secretary of State.*

Associations of "Custodian" (30 Words)

angel	A former English coin minted between the reigns of Edward IV and Charles I and bearing the figure of the archangel Michael killing a dragon. <i>God sent an angel to talk to Gideon.</i>
<u>angle</u>	Direct or incline at an angle. <i>The supporting frame is usually of aluminium angle bolted together.</i>
backer	Invests in a theatrical production. <i>He was the principal backer of the company.</i>
<u>bastion</u>	A natural rock formation resembling a man made bastion. <i>Cricket's last bastion of discrimination.</i>
bending	The act of bending something.
<u>caretaker</u>	A person employed to look after a building. <i>He acted as a caretaker until a new president could be elected.</i>
conservancy	The conservation of wildlife and the environment. <i>From the point of view of nature conservancy I'd rather see it left unspoilt.</i>
contraceptive	(of a method or device) serving to prevent pregnancy. <i>Contraceptive devices and medications.</i>
custody	Imprisonment. <i>My father was being taken into custody.</i>
<u>defend</u>	State or assert. <i>He won the party's nomination to defend the Welsh seat.</i>
<u>defender</u>	A person who defends someone or something. <i>Owen surged between two defenders then drove the ball out of the reach of the goalkeeper.</i>

deity	A representation of a god or goddess, such as a statue or carving. <i>Also on show is a bronze falcon deity.</i>
<u>guardian</u>	A person who cares for persons or property. <i>I am acting as guardian of my late brother s family.</i>
heaven	God (or the gods). <i>Lying by the pool with a good book is my idea of heaven.</i>
helmet	Armor plate that protects the head.
<u>janitor</u>	Someone employed to clean and maintain a building.
legal	Relating to theological legalism. <i>The European legal system.</i>
<u>librarian</u>	A professional person trained in library science and engaged in library services.
<u>parent</u>	Be or act as a parent to a child. <i>The parents of the bride.</i>
preclusive	Made impossible. <i>No preclusive action was taken.</i>
<u>preserve</u>	Fruit preserved by cooking with sugar. <i>Preserve the forest and the lakes.</i>
preserver	A cook who preserves fruits or meat. <i>They are the trusted preservers of law and order and they deserve our respect.</i>
preventive	A medicine or other treatment designed to prevent disease or ill health. <i>Preventive medicine.</i>
<u>protective</u>	Relating to the protection of domestic industries from foreign competition. <i>I felt protective towards her.</i>
<u>protector</u>	A person or thing that protects someone or something. <i>A man who became her protector adviser and friend.</i>
<u>savior</u>	A teacher and prophet born in Bethlehem and active in Nazareth; his life and sermons form the basis for Christianity (circa 4 BC - AD 29).
sentry	A person employed to keep watch for some anticipated event. <i>Two men stood sentry on the door every evening.</i>
steward	Someone who manages property or other affairs for someone else. <i>Security is found in reparticipating in community and stewarding nature.</i>
tutelar	Providing protective supervision; watching over or safeguarding. <i>Tutelary gods.</i>
tutelary	Relating to protection or a guardian. <i>Tutelary gods.</i>
