Associations of "Cut down" (30 Words)

abate	Make (something) less intense. <i>This action would not have been sufficient to abate the odour nuisance.</i>
abbreviate	Reduce in scope while retaining essential elements. <i>I decided to abbreviate my stay in Cambridge.</i>
abbreviated	Shortened; cut short. <i>An abbreviated version of the earlier work.</i>
abridge	Lessen, diminish, or curtail. <i>The introduction is abridged from the author's afterword to the novel.</i>
blade	A cut of beef from the shoulder blade. <i>The director a young blade in an oversized suit.</i>
curtail	Reduce in extent or quantity; impose a restriction on. <i>Curtail drinking in school.</i>
decrement	A process of becoming smaller or shorter. <i>The dose was reduced by 10 mg weekly decrements.</i>
deep	A deep part of the sea. <i>Deep cuts in the budget.</i>
dent	Mark with a dent. <i>It made a dent in my bank account.</i>
descending	Moving or sloping downwards. <i>A rocky descending path.</i>
dilute	(of colour or light) weak or low in concentration. <i>The reforms have been diluted.</i>
diminish	Decrease in size, extent, or range. <i>The new law is expected to diminish the government's chances.</i>
downgrade	Reduce to a lower grade, rank, or level of importance. <i>Downgrades by debt rating agencies outnumber upgrades by five to one.</i>

drop	An act of dropping supplies or troops by parachute. <i>He studied the shapes of low viscosity drops.</i>
encapsulate	Enclose (a message or signal) in a set of codes that allow transfer across networks. <i>Pancreatic tumours are encapsulated in a densely packed thicket of proteins and cells.</i>
engrave	Impress or affect deeply. <i>The event engraved itself into her memory.</i>
etch	Make an etching of. <i>The gallery has 12 000 prints engraved and etched by celebrated masters.</i>
haircut	An act of cutting a person's hair. <i>He s always very particular about his haircut.</i>
incise	Mark or decorate (an object or surface) with a cut or cuts. <i>A button incised with a skull.</i>
incision	The action or process of cutting into something. <i>An abdominal incision.</i>
knife	Cut or move cleanly through something with a knife like action. <i>The victim was knifed to death.</i>
piece	Assemble something from parts or pieces. <i>He wrote an interesting piece on Iran.</i>
retrench	Make a reduction, as in one's workforce. <i>If people are forced to retrench their expenditure trade will suffer.</i>
rundown	A reduction in the productivity or activities of a company or institution. <i>A rundown in the business would be a devastating blow to the local economy.</i>
shorten	Make shorter than originally intended; reduce or retrench in length or duration. <i>Ladbrokes shortened Nashwan s odds from 2 1 to 7 4.</i>
shrink	Move back or away, especially because of fear or disgust. <i>The metal is unsuitable for shrinking on to wooden staves.</i>
shrinkage	The amount by which something shrinks. <i>The material lost 2 inches per yard in shrinkage.</i>
truncate	Make shorter as if by cutting off. <i>A truncated pyramid.</i>
undercut	A stroke that puts reverse spin on the ball. <i>She styled her short bob into an edgy undercut.</i>
