## Associations of "Cut down" (30 Words)

<b>abate</b>	Make (something) less intense. <i>This action would not have been sufficient to <b>abate</b> the odour nuisance.</i>
<b>abbreviate</b>	Reduce in scope while retaining essential elements. <i>I decided to <b>abbreviate</b> my stay in Cambridge.</i>
<b>abbreviated</b>	Shortened; cut short. <i>An <b>abbreviated</b> version of the earlier work.</i>
<b>abridge</b>	Lessen, diminish, or curtail. <i>The introduction is <b>abridged</b> from the author's afterword to the novel.</i>
<b>blade</b>	A cut of beef from the shoulder blade. <i>The director a young <b>blade</b> in an oversized suit.</i>
<b>curtail</b>	Reduce in extent or quantity; impose a restriction on. <i><b>Curtail</b> drinking in school.</i>
<b>decrement</b>	A process of becoming smaller or shorter. <i>The dose was reduced by 10 mg weekly <b>decrements</b>.</i>
<b>deep</b>	A deep part of the sea. <i><b>Deep</b> cuts in the budget.</i>
<b>dent</b>	Mark with a dent. <i>It made a <b>dent</b> in my bank account.</i>
<b>descending</b>	Moving or sloping downwards. <i>A rocky <b>descending</b> path.</i>
<b>dilute</b>	(of colour or light) weak or low in concentration. <i>The reforms have been <b>diluted</b>.</i>
<b>diminish</b>	Decrease in size, extent, or range. <i>The new law is expected to <b>diminish</b> the government's chances.</i>
<b>downgrade</b>	Reduce to a lower grade, rank, or level of importance. <i><b>Downgrades</b> by debt rating agencies outnumber upgrades by five to one.</i>

<b>drop</b>	An act of dropping supplies or troops by parachute. <i>He studied the shapes of low viscosity <b>drops</b>.</i>
<b>encapsulate</b>	Enclose (a message or signal) in a set of codes that allow transfer across networks. <i>Pancreatic tumours are <b>encapsulated</b> in a densely packed thicket of proteins and cells.</i>
<b>engrave</b>	Impress or affect deeply. <i>The event <b>engraved</b> itself into her memory.</i>
<b>etch</b>	Make an etching of. <i>The gallery has 12 000 prints engraved and <b>etched</b> by celebrated masters.</i>
<b>haircut</b>	An act of cutting a person's hair. <i>He s always very particular about his <b>haircut</b>.</i>
<b>incise</b>	Mark or decorate (an object or surface) with a cut or cuts. <i>A button <b>incised</b> with a skull.</i>
<b>incision</b>	The action or process of cutting into something. <i>An abdominal <b>incision</b>.</i>
<b>knife</b>	Cut or move cleanly through something with a knife like action. <i>The victim was <b>knifed</b> to death.</i>
<b>piece</b>	Assemble something from parts or pieces. <i>He wrote an interesting <b>piece</b> on Iran.</i>
<b>retrench</b>	Make a reduction, as in one's workforce. <i>If people are forced to <b>retrench</b> their expenditure trade will suffer.</i>
<b>rundown</b>	A reduction in the productivity or activities of a company or institution. <i>A <b>rundown</b> in the business would be a devastating blow to the local economy.</i>
<b>shorten</b>	Make shorter than originally intended; reduce or retrench in length or duration. <i>Ladbrokes <b>shortened</b> Nashwan s odds from 2 1 to 7 4.</i>
<b>shrink</b>	Move back or away, especially because of fear or disgust. <i>The metal is unsuitable for <b>shrinking</b> on to wooden staves.</i>
<b>shrinkage</b>	The amount by which something shrinks. <i>The material lost 2 inches per yard in <b>shrinkage</b>.</i>
<b>truncate</b>	Make shorter as if by cutting off. <i>A <b>truncated</b> pyramid.</i>
<b>undercut</b>	A stroke that puts reverse spin on the ball. <i>She styled her short bob into an edgy <b>undercut</b>.</i>
