- *The movement of a simple substance through the soil, rocks, water, atmosphere, and living organisms of the earth.*

- *A series of events that are regularly repeated in the same order.*

### **bicycle**

A vehicle consisting of two wheels held in a frame one behind the other, propelled by pedals and steered with handlebars attached to the front wheel.

<b>bike</b>	A wheeled vehicle that has two wheels and is moved by foot pedals. <i>My friends and I would ride our <b>bikes</b>.</i>
<b>cps</b>	The unit of frequency; one hertz has a periodic interval of one second.
<b>cycle per second</b>	A wheeled vehicle that has two wheels and is moved by foot pedals.
<b>cycles/second</b>	An interval during which a recurring sequence of events occurs.
<b>hertz</b>	The unit of frequency one hertz has a periodic interval of one second.
<b>hz</b>	The unit of frequency; one hertz has a periodic interval of one second (named for Heinrich Rudolph Hertz).
<b>oscillation</b>	Regular variation in magnitude or position about a central point, especially of an electric current or voltage. <i>The plot s <b>oscillation</b> between bleak and comic elements.</i>
<b>pedal cycle</b>	A sustained bass note.
<b>revolution</b>	(in Marxism) the class struggle which is expected to lead to political change and the triumph of communism. <i>The industrial <b>revolution</b> was also a cultural <b>revolution</b>.</i>
<b>rhythm</b>	A particular pattern formed by musical rhythm. <i>Limericks have a characteristic <b>rhythm</b> and rhyme scheme.</i>
<b>rotation</b>	The passing of a privilege or responsibility to each member of a group in a regularly recurring order. <i>She was completing a <b>rotation</b> in trauma surgery.</i>
<b><u>round</u></b>	Each of a succession of stages in a competition, in each of which more candidates are eliminated. <i>Their lives were a daily <b>round</b> of housework and laundry.</i>
<b>run</b>	A score in baseball made by a runner touching all four bases safely. <i>A cross country <b>run</b>.</i>
<b><u>sequence</u></b>	Serial arrangement in which things follow in logical order or a recurrent pattern. <i>These are enzymes which will cleave only at specific base <b>sequences</b> in the DNA.</i>
<b>series</b>	A group of postage stamps having a common theme or a group of coins or currency selected as a group for study or collection. <i>A <b>series</b> of five stamps issued today to mark the 14th World Orchid Conference.</i>
<b>succession</b>	The action or process of inheriting a title, office, property, etc. <i>The <b>succession</b> to the Crown was disputed.</i>
<b>wheel</b>	A machine or structure having a wheel as its essential part. <i>The final release from the <b>wheel</b> of life.</i>

<b>travel</b>	Travel from place to place as for the purpose of finding work preaching or acting as a judge. <i>He usually <b>travels</b> well but he did get a bit upset on a very rough crossing.</i>
<b>wheel</b>	Wheel somebody or something. <i>The stars <b>wheeled</b> through the sky.</i>

<b>cycling</b>	The sport of traveling on a bicycle or motorcycle.
<b>cyclist</b>	A person who rides a bicycle.
<u><b>drive</b></u>	Have certain properties when driven. <i>A variable speed <b>drive</b> permitted operation through a range of speeds.</i>
<u><b>driver</b></u>	A golfer who hits the golf ball with a driver. <i>A taxi <b>driver</b>.</i>
<b>freewheel</b>	Coast in a vehicle using the freewheel. <i>The postman came <b>freewheeling</b> down the track.</i>
<b>jalopy</b>	A car that is old and unreliable. <i>His father got worried about him driving that old <b>jalopy</b> it wasn't safe.</i>
<b>motor</b>	Travel in a motor vehicle. <i>Demand is the principle <b>motor</b> force governing economic activity.</i>
<b>motorcycle</b>	Ride a motorcycle.
<b>motorist</b>	Someone who drives (or travels in) an automobile.
<b>mounted</b>	Decorated with applied ornamentation; often used in combination-F.V.W.Mason. <i>The trim brass <b>mounted</b> carbine of the ranger.</i>
<b>pedal</b>	Each of a set of two or three levers on a piano particularly also sustaining pedal one which when depressed prevents the dampers from stopping the sound when the keys are released The second is the soft pedal a third if present produces either selective sustaining or complete muffling of the tone. <i>He was coming down the path on his bike <b>pedalling</b> hard.</i>
<b>pulley</b>	Hoist with a pulley. <i>The tree house was built on the ground and <b>pulleyed</b> into the branches.</i>
<u><b>ride</b></u>	A mechanical device that you ride for amusement or excitement. <i>Don't <b>ride</b> me so hard over my failure.</i>
<b>rider</b>	A condition or proviso added to something already agreed. <i>Two <b>riders</b> approached the cottage.</i>

<b>riding</b>	The sport or activity of riding horses. <i>A <b>riding</b> accident.</i>
<b>scooter</b>	Travel or ride on a scooter. <i>A snow <b>scooter</b>.</i>
<b>speeder</b>	A driver who exceeds the safe speed limit.
<b><u>spoke</u></b>	One of the crosspieces that form the steps of a ladder.
<b>surrey</b>	A light four-wheeled horse-drawn carriage; has two or four seats.
<b>taxi</b>	A motor vehicle licensed to transport passengers in return for payment of a fare and typically fitted with a taximeter. <i>I ll take a <b>taxi</b> from the air terminal.</i>
<b>tram</b>	Travel by tram. <i>A <b>tramcar</b> carries coal out of a coal mine.</i>
<b>tricycle</b>	Ride on a tricycle. <i>A small boy <b>tricycled</b> to the end of his driveway.</i>
<b><u>vehicle</u></b>	A thing used to express, embody, or fulfil something. <i>A heavy goods <b>vehicle</b>.</i>
