<b>absurd</b>	Inconsistent with reason or logic or common sense- Walter Lippman. <i>The <b>absurd</b> predicament of seeming to argue that virtue is highly desirable but intensely unpleasant.</i>
<b>balmy</b>	Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular. <i><b>Balmy</b> days and nights.</i>
<b>barmy</b>	Marked by spirited enjoyment. <i>I thought I was going <b>barmy</b> at first.</i>
<b>bats</b>	Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular.
<b>batty</b>	Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular. <i>You ll drive me <b>batty</b>.</i>
<b>bonkers</b>	Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular. <i>You re stark raving <b>bonkers</b>.</i>
<b>buggy</b>	Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular.

<b>cracked</b>	(of a person's voice) having an unusual harshness or pitch, especially through strain. <i>Her voice emerged <b>cracked</b> from a throat tight with dread.</i>
<b>crackers</b>	Extremely angry. <i>If Luke wasn't here I'd go <b>crackers</b>.</i>
<b>cretinous</b>	Foolish or stupid.
<b>dim-witted</b>	Lacking mental capacity and subtlety.
<b>doting on</b>	Extravagantly or foolishly loving and indulgent.
<b>dotty</b>	Infatuated with. <i>A <b>dotty</b> old lady.</i>
<b>dull</b>	(of an edge or blade) blunt. <i>So exhausted she was <b>dull</b> to what went on about her.</i>
<b>empty-headed</b>	Lacking seriousness; given to frivolity.
<b>farcical</b>	Relating to or resembling farce, especially because of absurd or ridiculous aspects. <i>He considered the whole idea <b>farcical</b>.</i>
<b>fruity</b>	Sexually suggestive in content or style. <i>He disparages as <b>fruity</b> a marble fountain of a nymph.</i>
<b>half-witted</b>	Retarded in intellectual development.
<b>haywire</b>	Erratic; out of control. <i>Her imagination had gone <b>haywire</b>.</i>
<b>idiotic</b>	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i>An <b>idiotic</b> idea.</i>
<b>imbecilic</b>	Having a mental age of three to seven years.
<b>infatuated with</b>	Marked by foolish or unreasoning fondness.
<b>kookie</b>	Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular.
<b>kooky</b>	Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular. <i>I like <b>kooky</b> foreign films.</i>
<b>laughable</b>	Arousing or provoking laughter. <i>A contribution so small as to be <b>laughable</b>.</i>
<b>loco</b>	Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular.
<b>loony</b>	Mad or silly. <i><b>Loony</b> drivers.</i>
<b>loopy</b>	Having many loops. <i>A big <b>loopy</b> signature.</i>

<b>ludicrous</b>	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i><b>Ludicrous</b> green hair.</i>
<b>moronic</b>	Having a mental age of between eight and twelve years. <i>Television s latest <b>moronic</b> soap opera.</i>
<b>nuts</b>	Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular. <i>The way he turns on the television as soon as he walks in drives me <b>nuts</b>.</i>
<b>nutty</b>	Tasting like nuts. <i>He came up with a few <b>nutty</b> proposals.</i>
<b>preposterous</b>	Contrary to reason or common sense; utterly absurd or ridiculous. <i>A <b>preposterous</b> suggestion.</i>
<b>ridiculous</b>	Deserving or inviting derision or mockery; absurd. <i>It seems absolutely <b>ridiculous</b> that anyone would try to pull a stunt like this.</i>
<b>risible</b>	Arousing or provoking laughter. <i><b>Risible</b> courtroom antics.</i>
<b>round the bend</b>	Having a circular shape.
<b>simple</b>	Humble and unpretentious. <i>The <b>simple</b> truth.</i>
<b>simple-minded</b>	Lacking subtlety and insight.
<b>slow</b>	At a slow tempo. <i>Bake the dish in a preheated <b>slow</b> oven.</i>
<b>slow-witted</b>	Retarded in intellectual development.
<b>smitten with</b>	Affected by something overwhelming.
<b>vacuous</b>	Devoid of intelligence. <i>A <b>vacuous</b> mind.</i>
<b>vapid</b>	Lacking significance or liveliness or spirit or zest. <i>A <b>vapid</b> smile.</i>
<b>very fond of</b>	Being the exact same one; not any other.
<b>wacky</b>	Funny or amusing in a slightly odd or peculiar way. <i>Some <b>wacky</b> plan for selling more books.</i>
<b>whacky</b>	Ludicrous, foolish.
<b>witless</b>	(of especially persons) lacking sense or understanding or judgment. <i>I was scared <b>witless</b>.</i>

## Associations of "Daft" (30 Words)

<b>absurdity</b>	A message whose content is at variance with reason. <i>The crowd laughed at the <b>absurdity</b> of the clown's behavior.</i>
<b>certifiable</b>	Able or needing to be officially recorded. <i>Encephalitis was a <b>certifiable</b> condition.</i>
<b>crazy</b>	Extremely angry. <i><b>Crazy</b> about cars and racing.</i>
<b>dumb</b>	Make dumb or unheard silence. <i>They stared in <b>dumb</b> amazement.</i>
<b>fatuity</b>	A ludicrous folly.
<b>fatuous</b>	Silly and pointless. <i>A <b>fatuous</b> comment.</i>
<b>folly</b>	A stupid mistake. <i>Trying to drive through a blizzard is the height of <b>folly</b>.</i>
<b>fool</b>	Fool or hoax. <i>I felt a bit of a <b>fool</b>.</i>
<b>foolery</b>	Silly or foolish behaviour. <i>We endured his <b>foolery</b> all afternoon.</i>
<b>freak</b>	A person or animal that is markedly unusual or deformed. <i>A bodybuilding <b>freak</b>.</i>
<b>goofy</b>	Foolish or harmlessly eccentric. <i>A <b>goofy</b> grin.</i>
<b>imbecility</b>	A stupid mistake.
<b>inadvisable</b>	Not advisable. <i>Running on the ice is <b>inadvisable</b>.</i>
<b>inane</b>	Devoid of intelligence. <i>Don't badger people with <b>inane</b> questions.</i>
<b>insane</b>	In a state of mind which prevents normal perception, behaviour, or social interaction; seriously mentally ill. <i>Was declared <b>insane</b>.</i>
<b>insanity</b>	The state of being seriously mentally ill; madness. <i>It might be pure <b>insanity</b> to take this loan.</i>
<b>lunacy</b>	The state of being a lunatic; insanity (not in technical use). <i>It has been suggested that originality demands a degree of <b>lunacy</b>.</i>

<b>mad</b>	Make someone mad. <i>A man who had gone <b>mad</b>.</i>
<b>mentally</b>	In your mind. <i>Soldiers become physically and <b>mentally</b> exhausted.</i>
<b>nuts</b>	Mad. <i>The way he turns on the television as soon as he walks in drives me <b>nuts</b>.</i>
<b>ridiculous</b>	Inspiring scornful pity- Dashiell Hammett. <i>That <b>ridiculous</b> tartan cap.</i>
<b>ridiculously</b>	So as to cause surprise or disbelief. <i><b>Ridiculously</b> I felt like crying.</i>
<b>silly</b>	Ridiculously trivial or frivolous. <i>Don't be <b>silly</b> she said.</i>
<b><u>simpleton</u></b>	A person lacking intelligence or common sense. <i>Stop grinning at me like a <b>simpleton</b>.</i>
<b><u>stupidity</u></b>	Behaviour that shows a lack of good sense or judgement. <i>A comedy of infantile <b>stupidity</b>.</i>
<b><u>twit</u></b>	Aggravation by deriding or mocking or criticizing.
<b>uneducated</b>	Not having a good education. <i>Women from <b>uneducated</b> backgrounds.</i>
<b>vacuous</b>	Devoid of significance or force. <i>A <b>vacuous</b> space.</i>
<b>zany</b>	A zany person. <i>A <b>zany</b> sense of humor.</i>
