### Definitions of "Daily" as a noun

- *A newspaper that is published every day.*
- *A woman who is employed to clean someone else's house each day.*
- *A newspaper published every day except Sunday.*



## Synonyms of "Daily" as a noun (11 Words)

<b>attendant</b>	An event or situation that happens at the same time as or in connection with another. <i>He had become a regular <b>attendant</b> at chapel.</i>
<b>bulletin</b>	A short official statement or broadcast summary of news.
<b>digest</b>	A substance or mixture obtained by digestion. <i>A <b>digest</b> of their findings.</i>
<b>gazette</b>	An official publication containing lists of government appointments and promotions and other public notices. <i>An announcement in Tuesday's London <b>Gazette</b> will make clear that he is being stripped of the honour.</i>

<b>magazine</b>	A business firm that publishes magazines. <i>He works for a <b>magazine</b>.</i>
<b>newsletter</b>	A bulletin issued periodically to the members of a society or other organization.
<b>periodical</b>	A magazine or newspaper published at regular intervals.
<b>professional organ</b>	An authority qualified to teach apprentices.
<b>publication</b>	The act of issuing printed materials. <i>Scientific <b>publications</b>.</i>
<b>retainer</b>	A reduced rent paid to retain accommodation during a period of non-occupancy. <i>A guitar string <b>retainer</b>.</i>
<b>review</b>	A subsequent examination of a patient for the purpose of monitoring earlier treatment. <i>Cue and <b>review</b> which plays the tape backwards or forwards at high speed.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Daily" as a noun

- *As a co-producer he has to view the dailies.*
- *The trial was reported in all the popular dailies.*



## Daily as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Daily" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "daily" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Done, produced, or occurring every day or every weekday.*
- *Of or belonging to or occurring every day.*
- *Appropriate for ordinary or routine occasions.*
- *Relating to the period of a single day.*



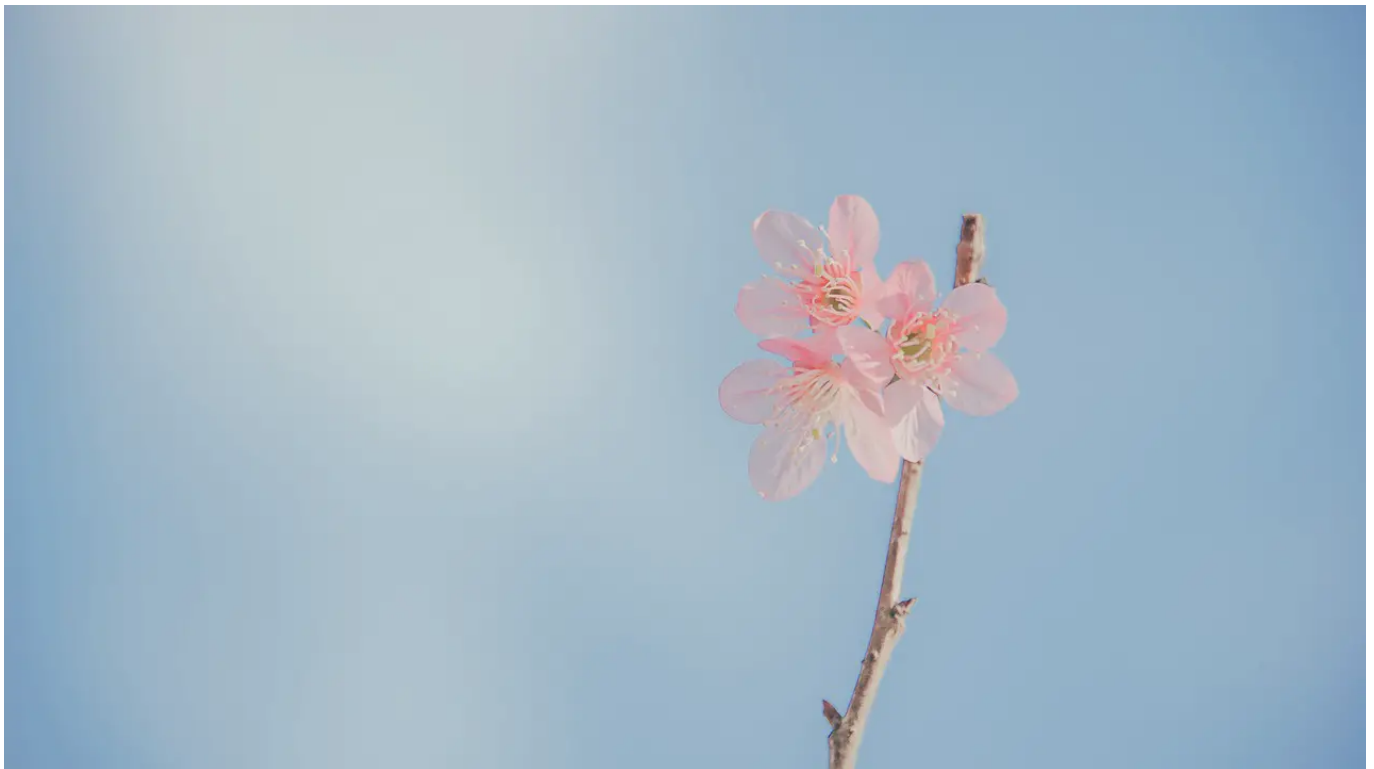
## Synonyms of "Daily" as an adjective (4 Words)

- casual** Not showing effort or strain.  
*Information collected by **casual** methods and in their spare time.*
- done every day** Cooked until ready to serve.
- everyday** Happening or used every day; daily.  
*The familiar **everyday** world.*
- quotidian** Of or occurring every day; daily.  
*His story is an aching human one mired in **quotidian** details.*

- *A daily newspaper.*
- *Boats can be hired for a daily rate.*
- *A daily paper.*
- *Daily routine.*



## Associations of "Daily" (30 Words)

- almanac** An annual publication containing tabular information in a particular field or fields arranged according to the calendar of a given year.
- annual** An annual plant.  
*The sponsored walk became an **annual** event.*
- annually** By the year; every year (usually with reference to a sum of money paid or received).  
*They travel to China **annually**.*
- biannual** Occurring or payable twice each year.  
*The **biannual** meeting of the planning committee.*

<b>biennial</b>	A plant having a life cycle that normally takes two seasons from germination to death to complete flowering biennials usually bloom and fruit in the second season. A <b>biennial</b> life cycle.
<b>bimonthly</b>	Every two months. <b>Bimonthly</b> visits.
<b>biweekly</b>	A periodical that appears every two weeks or twice a week. She followed her doctor's instructions to undergo health checks <b>biweekly</b> .
<b>calendar</b>	Enter something in a calendar or timetable. It was at their discretion whether to index or <b>calendar</b> the records.
<b>commute</b>	A regular journey of some distance to and from your place of work. There is standing room only on the high speed <b>commute</b> .
<b>cyclical</b>	Recurring in cycles. The <b>cyclical</b> nature of the cement industry.
<b>day-to-day</b>	The time after sunrise and before sunset while it is light outside.
<b>diurnal</b>	(of animals) active in the daytime. <b>Diurnal</b> and nocturnal offices.
<b>frequent</b>	Be a regular or frequent visitor to a certain place. Pubs <b>frequented</b> by soldiers.
<b>monthly</b>	A magazine that is published once a month. <b>Monthly</b> payments.
<b>perennial</b>	A perennial plant. Spring streams rise from <b>perennial</b> springs.
<b>periodic</b>	Relating to the periodic table of the elements. <b>Periodic</b> feelings of anxiety.
<b>periodical</b>	Happening or recurring at regular intervals. Britain's best <b>periodical</b> art magazine.
<b>periodically</b>	From time to time; occasionally. The newsletter is sent out <b>periodically</b> to update members.
<b>periodicity</b>	The quality or character of being periodic; the tendency to recur at intervals. The <b>periodicity</b> of the sunspot cycle.
<b>quarterly</b>	Of or relating to or consisting of a quarter. Interest is compounded <b>quarterly</b> .
<b>regular</b>	A soldier in the regular army. His <b>regular</b> calls on his customers.
<b>regularity</b>	A property of polygons: the property of having equal sides and equal angles. He came to see her with increasing <b>regularity</b> .



<b><u>regularly</u></b>	In a regular manner. <i>A <b>regularly</b> updated news page.</i>
<b>routine</b>	Organize according to a routine. <i>All had been <b>routined</b> with smoothness.</i>
<b>triennial</b>	Recurring every three years. <i>The <b>triennial</b> meeting of the Association.</i>
<b>twice</b>	Two times; on two occasions. <i>The tablets should be taken <b>twice</b> a day.</i>
<b><u>weekly</u></b>	A periodical that is published every week (or 52 issues per year). <i><b>Weekly</b> paper.</i>
<b>workday</b>	A day on which one works. <i>Saturdays were <b>workdays</b> for him.</i>
<b><u>year</u></b>	The period of 365 days or 366 days in leap years starting from the first of January used for reckoning time in ordinary circumstances. <i>The Muslim <b>year</b>.</i>
<b><u>yearly</u></b>	Once a year or every year. <i>Rent was paid <b>yearly</b>.</i>
