crisp	(of a substance) firm, dry, and brittle. <i>Her answer was crisp.</i>
dashing	Lively and spirited. A dashing hero.
debonair	Having a cheerful, lively, and self-confident air. A debonair gentleman.
elegant	(of a scientific theory or solution to a problem) pleasingly ingenious and simple. An elegant comfortable house.
jaunty	Having a cheerful, lively, and self-confident air. A jaunty red hat.
natty	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. A natty blue blazer.
neat	(of liquid, especially spirits) not diluted or mixed with anything else. Alan noted down the orders in his neat precise script.
neat and tidy	Very good.
raffish	Marked by a carefree unconventionality or disreputableness. A cocktail party given by some raffish bachelors.
rakish	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>He had a rakish debonair look.</i>
smart	Having or showing a quick-witted intelligence. <i>Smart</i> children talk earlier than the average.
smartly dressed	Capable of independent and apparently intelligent action.
<u>snappy</u>	Cleverly concise; neat. Snappy catchphrases.
<u>spiffy</u>	Smart in appearance. A spiffy new outfit.
spruce	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners.
<u>tidy</u>	Of hair neat and tidy. <i>His scrupulously tidy apartment.</i>



trim	Severely simple in line or design. A trim beard.
well dressed	Resulting favorably.
well groomed	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.
well turned out	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.

modish	In the current fashion or style. It seems sad that such a scholar should feel compelled to use this modish <i>jargon</i> .
natty	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. A palmtop computer with many natty features.
newfangled	Different from what one is used to; objectionably new. <i>Newfangled</i> ideas.
raffish	Unconventional and slightly disreputable, especially in an attractive way. A cocktail party given by some raffish bachelors.
rakish	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>He had a rakish debonair look.</i>
recency	The property of having happened or appeared not long ago.
recent	New. His recent visit to Britain.
recently	In the recent past. I recently bought a CD player.
<u>seductive</u>	Tending to entice into a desired action or state. A seductive voice.
smart	Mental pain or suffering. You look very smart .
spruce	Light soft moderately strong wood of spruce trees used especially for timbers and millwork. <i>He</i> spruce <i>d</i> up for the party.



<u>stylish</u>	Fashionably elegant and sophisticated. A stylish batsman.
<u>thin</u>	Lose thickness become thin or thinner. <i>Cut the ham as thin as possible.</i>
unconventional	Not conventional or conformist. Her unconventional dress and hair style.
up-to-date	A particular but unspecified point in time.
urbanity	Polished courtesy; elegance of manner. A picture of banal urbanity .
