Synonyms of "Dapper" as an adjective (22 Words)

besuited	(of a person, especially a man) wearing a suit. <i>Besuited politicians have been taking part in televised debates.</i>
<u>chic</u>	Elegantly and stylishly fashionable. <i>Chic elegance.</i>
crisp	(of a substance) firm, dry, and brittle. <i>Her answer was crisp.</i>
dashing	Lively and spirited. <i>A dashing hero.</i>
debonair	Having a cheerful, lively, and self-confident air. <i>A debonair gentleman.</i>
elegant	(of a scientific theory or solution to a problem) pleasingly ingenious and simple. <i>An elegant comfortable house.</i>
jaunty	Having a cheerful, lively, and self-confident air. <i>A jaunty red hat.</i>
natty	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>A natty blue blazer.</i>
neat	(of liquid, especially spirits) not diluted or mixed with anything else. <i>Alan noted down the orders in his neat precise script.</i>
neat and tidy	Very good.
raffish	Marked by a carefree unconventionality or disreputableness. <i>A cocktail party given by some raffish bachelors.</i>
rakish	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>He had a rakish debonair look.</i>
smart	Having or showing a quick-witted intelligence. <i>Smart children talk earlier than the average.</i>
smartly dressed	Capable of independent and apparently intelligent action.
<u>snappy</u>	Cleverly concise; neat. <i>Snappy catchphrases.</i>
<u>spiffy</u>	Smart in appearance. <i>A spiffy new outfit.</i>
spruce	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners.
<u>tidy</u>	Of hair neat and tidy. <i>His scrupulously tidy apartment.</i>

trim	Severely simple in line or design. A trim beard.
well dressed	Resulting favorably.
well groomed	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.
well turned out	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.

abreast	Being up to particular standard or level especially in being up to date in knowledge. <i>They were riding three abreast.</i>
<u>alongside</u>	Side by side.
<u>chic</u>	Elegantly and stylishly fashionable. <i>She looked every inch the chic Frenchwoman.</i>
craze	A fine crack in a glaze or other surface. <i>Crazed by hunger the population began to turn on the rebels.</i>
fad	An interest followed with exaggerated zeal. <i>His fads about the type of coffee he must have.</i>
faddish	Intensely fashionable or popular for a short period of time. <i>Tastes in flavoured coffee are so faddish.</i>

fashion	The latest and most admired style in clothes and cosmetics and behavior. <i>She fashioned a tent out of a sheet and a few sticks.</i>
<u>fashionable</u>	Popular and considered appealing or fashionable at the time. <i>They risked being scoffed at by their more fashionable friends.</i>
inimitable	So good or unusual as to be impossible to copy; unique. <i>An inimitable style.</i>
jaunty	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>There was no mistaking that jaunty walk.</i>
lately	In the recent past. <i>She hasn't been looking too well lately.</i>
<u>latest</u>	The most recent news or fashion. <i>Have you heard the latest.</i>
<u>modern</u>	Belonging to the modern era since the Middle Ages. <i>Modern history.</i>
modish	In the current fashion or style. <i>It seems sad that such a scholar should feel compelled to use this modish jargon.</i>
natty	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>A palmtop computer with many natty features.</i>
newfangled	Different from what one is used to; objectionably new. <i>Newfangled ideas.</i>
raffish	Unconventional and slightly disreputable, especially in an attractive way. <i>A cocktail party given by some raffish bachelors.</i>
rakish	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>He had a rakish debonair look.</i>
recency	The property of having happened or appeared not long ago.
recent	New. <i>His recent visit to Britain.</i>
recently	In the recent past. <i>I recently bought a CD player.</i>
<u>seductive</u>	Tending to entice into a desired action or state. <i>A seductive voice.</i>
smart	Mental pain or suffering. <i>You look very smart.</i>
spruce	Light soft moderately strong wood of spruce trees used especially for timbers and millwork. <i>He spruced up for the party.</i>

Fashionably elegant and sophisticated.
*A **stylish** batsman.*

thin

Lose thickness become thin or thinner.
*Cut the ham as **thin** as possible.*

unconventional

Not conventional or conformist.
*Her **unconventional** dress and hair style.*

up-to-date

A particular but unspecified point in time.

urbanity

Polished courtesy; elegance of manner.
*A picture of banal **urbanity**.*

wizardry

Exceptional creative ability.
*Pless s **wizardry** with a bat.*
