## Data as a Noun

### Definitions of "Data" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “data” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The quantities, characters, or symbols on which operations are performed by a computer, which may be stored and transmitted in the form of electrical signals and recorded on magnetic, optical, or mechanical recording media.*
- *Things known or assumed as facts, making the basis of reasoning or calculation.*
- *A collection of facts from which conclusions may be drawn.*
- *Facts and statistics collected together for reference or analysis.*



## Synonyms of "Data" as a noun (8 Words)

- details** A crew of workers selected for a particular task.  
*After the trial he gave us the real **details**.*
- facts** A concept whose truth can be proved.  
*Scientific hypotheses are not **facts**.*
- features** The principal (full-length) film in a program at a movie theater.  
*An expression of pleasure crossed his **features**.*
- figures** A model of a bodily form (especially of a person).  
*She made the best score on compulsory **figures**.*
- information** In information theory a mathematical quantity expressing the probability of occurrence of a particular sequence of symbols impulses etc as against that of alternative sequences.  
*The signal contained thousands of bits of **information**.*

**particulars** (logic) a proposition that asserts something about some (but not all) members of a class.

*He always reasons from the particular to the general.*

**specifics** A fact about some part (as opposed to general).

*Quinine is a specific for malaria.*

**statistics** The practice or science of collecting and analysing numerical data in large quantities, especially for the purpose of inferring proportions in a whole from those in a representative sample.



## Usage Examples of "Data" as a noun

- *There is very little data available.*
- *Statistical data.*



## Associations of "Data" (30 Words)

- agglomerate** A volcanic rock consisting of large fragments bonded together.  
*An **agglomerated** flower head.*
- aggregate** Amount in the aggregate to.  
***Aggregate** expenses include expenses of all divisions combined for the entire year.*
- amass** Gather together or accumulate (a large amount or number of material or things) over a period of time.  
*She is **amassing** a lot of data for her thesis.*
- arithmetic** Relating to or involving arithmetic.  
***Arithmetic** had never been her strong point.*

<b>binary</b>	A binary star. <i>A <b>binary</b> star is a system in which two stars revolve around each other.</i>
<b>check</b>	Write out a check on a bank account. <i>The dog <b>checked</b>.</i>
<b>collate</b>	Verify the number and order of (the sheets of a book). <i>All the information obtained is being <b>collated</b>.</i>
<b>collection</b>	A sum of money raised during a church or charity collection. <i>Refuse <b>collection</b>.</i>
<b>confirm</b>	Administer the religious rite of confirmation to. <i>The organization has <b>confirmed</b> the appointment of Mr Collins as managing director.</i>
<b>cumulate</b>	Attach two double bonds to the same carbon atom. <i>They appear to have formed from <b>cumulates</b> in the root of a magma chamber.</i>
<b>decimal</b>	A number in the decimal system. <i><b>Decimal</b> arithmetic.</i>
<b>encyclopedia</b>	A book or set of books giving information on many subjects or on many aspects of one subject and typically arranged alphabetically.
<b>formalize</b>	Give a definite structure or shape to. <i>We became able to <b>formalize</b> our thoughts.</i>
<b>oversee</b>	Supervise (a person or their work), especially in an official capacity. <i>The Home Secretary <b>oversees</b> the police service.</i>
<b>patrol</b>	Maintain the security of by carrying out a patrol. <i>The garrison had to <b>patrol</b> the streets to maintain order.</i>
<b>philatelist</b>	A collector and student of postage stamps.
<b>poll</b>	Cut off the top of a tree or plant typically to encourage further growth pollard. <i>The network manager can also use the software to <b>poll</b> each Mac on the net.</i>
<b>proof</b>	Proofread a text. <i>A <b>proof</b> copy is sent up for checking.</i>
<b>reconnaissance</b>	Military observation of a region to locate an enemy or ascertain strategic features. <i>After a <b>reconnaissance</b> British forces took the island.</i>
<b>reconnoiter</b>	Explore, often with the goal of finding something or somebody.
<b>reconvene</b>	Meet again. <i>The bill will be considered when the Legislature <b>reconvenes</b> next Fall.</i>

<b>sentry</b>	A soldier stationed to keep guard or to control access to a place. <i>On <b>sentry</b> duty.</i>
<b>standardize</b>	Evaluate by comparing with a standard. <i>We could <b>standardize</b> on US equipment.</i>
<b>statistic</b>	An event or person regarded as no more than a piece of data (used to suggest an inappropriately impersonal approach). <i>He was just another <b>statistic</b>.</i>
<b>substantiation</b>	The act of validating; finding or testing the truth of something.
<b>suitability</b>	The quality of having the properties that are right for a specific purpose. <i>The <b>suitability</b> of residential accommodation varied widely.</i>
<b>surveillance</b>	Close observation of a person or group (usually by the police). <i>He found himself put under <b>surveillance</b> by British military intelligence.</i>
<a href="#"><u>survey</u></a>	A written report detailing the findings of a building survey. <i>The third type of report is a full structural <b>survey</b>.</i>
<b>validation</b>	The act of validating; finding or testing the truth of something. <i>New courses subject to <b>validation</b> include an MSc in Urban Forestry.</i>
<b>verification</b>	The process of ensuring that procedures laid down in weapons limitation agreements are followed. <i>The <b>verification</b> of official documents.</i>
