Associations of "Dated" (30 Words)

anachronistic	Belonging to a period other than that being portrayed. <i>Titus benefits from the effective use of anachronistic elements like cars and loudspeakers.</i>
ancient	A person who lived in ancient times. <i>A solitary ancient in a tweed jacket.</i>
antediluvian	Of or relating to the period before the biblical flood. <i>A ramshackle antediluvian tenement.</i>
antiquate	Make obsolete or old-fashioned.
antiquated	So extremely old as seeming to belong to an earlier period. <i>This antiquated central heating system.</i>
antique	Make something resemble an antique by artificial means. <i>Sanding will change the lustre of the sanded spot especially if the finish has been antiqued.</i>
archaic	So extremely old as seeming to belong to an earlier period. <i>Prisons are run on archaic methods.</i>
backwards	(of a movement) in the direction of one’s back. <i>Penny glanced backwards.</i>
battered	Having suffered repeated violence from a spouse, partner, or parent. <i>His battered old hat.</i>
bygone	Past events to be put aside. <i>The museum consists of a fascinating collection of rural bygones.</i>
elder	An official in the early Christian Church, or of various Protestant Churches and sects. <i>The elder of the two sons.</i>
ex	The 24th letter of the Roman alphabet. <i>All his exes live in Texas.</i>

expired	Having come to an end or become void after passage of a period of time. <i>An expired passport.</i>
hoary	Used in names of animals and plants covered with whitish fur or short hairs e.g. hoary bat, hoary cress. <i>A hoary old fellow with a face of white stubble.</i>
inoperative	Not working or taking effect. <i>An inoperative law.</i>
invalid	Having no cogency or legal force. <i>Her invalid husband.</i>
null	Combine a signal with another in order to create a null cancel out. <i>The establishment of a new interim government was declared null and void.</i>
obsolete	Cause a product or idea to become obsolete by replacing it with something new. <i>The disposal of old and obsolete machinery.</i>
old	Used informally especially for emphasis old adj. of a very early stage in development. <i>We moved back into our old house.</i>
outdated	Out of date; obsolete. <i>Outdated equipment.</i>
outmoded	Out of fashion. <i>An outmoded Victorian building.</i>
paleolithic	Of or relating to the second period of the Stone Age (following the eolithic). <i>Paleolithic artifacts.</i>
passe	Out of fashion.
past	A verb tense that expresses actions or states in the past. <i>Forget the past.</i>
retrograde	Show retrograde motion. <i>All the planets will at some time appear to retrograde.</i>
rusty	(of black clothes) discoloured by age. <i>Rusty deposits.</i>
senile	(of a person) having or showing the weaknesses or diseases of old age, especially a loss of mental faculties. <i>Senile decay.</i>
superannuated	Too old to be useful. <i>A superannuated hippy.</i>

useless

Having no ability or skill in a specified activity or area.

*We tried to pacify him but it was **useless**.*

widower

A man whose spouse is often away participating in a specified sport or activity.

*Her new found passion has turned me into a tennis **widower**.*
