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## Associations of "Dated" (30 Words)

<b>anachronistic</b>	Belonging to a period other than that being portrayed. <i>Titus benefits from the effective use of <b>anachronistic</b> elements like cars and loudspeakers.</i>
<b><a href="#">ancient</a></b>	A person who lived in ancient times. <i>A solitary <b>ancient</b> in a tweed jacket.</i>
<b>antediluvian</b>	Of or relating to the period before the biblical flood. <i>A ramshackle <b>antediluvian</b> tenement.</i>
<b>antiquate</b>	Make obsolete or old-fashioned.
<b><a href="#">antiquated</a></b>	So extremely old as seeming to belong to an earlier period. <i>This <b>antiquated</b> central heating system.</i>
<b>antique</b>	Make something resemble an antique by artificial means. <i>Sanding will change the lustre of the sanded spot especially if the finish has been <b>antiqued</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">archaic</a></b>	So extremely old as seeming to belong to an earlier period. <i>Prisons are run on <b>archaic</b> methods.</i>
<b>backwards</b>	(of a movement) in the direction of one’s back. <i>Penny glanced <b>backwards</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">battered</a></b>	Having suffered repeated violence from a spouse, partner, or parent. <i>His <b>battered</b> old hat.</i>
<b>bygone</b>	Past events to be put aside. <i>The museum consists of a fascinating collection of rural <b>bygones</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">elder</a></b>	An official in the early Christian Church, or of various Protestant Churches and sects. <i>The <b>elder</b> of the two sons.</i>
<b>ex</b>	The 24th letter of the Roman alphabet. <i>All his <b>exes</b> live in Texas.</i>

<b>expired</b>	Having come to an end or become void after passage of a period of time. <i>An <b>expired</b> passport.</i>
<b>hoary</b>	Used in names of animals and plants covered with whitish fur or short hairs e g hoary bat hoary cress. <i>A <b>hoary</b> old fellow with a face of white stubble.</i>
<b>inoperative</b>	Not working or taking effect. <i>An <b>inoperative</b> law.</i>
<b><u>invalid</u></b>	Having no cogency or legal force. <i>Her <b>invalid</b> husband.</i>
<b><u>null</u></b>	Combine a signal with another in order to create a null cancel out. <i>The establishment of a new interim government was declared <b>null</b> and void.</i>
<b><u>obsolete</u></b>	Cause a product or idea to become obsolete by replacing it with something new. <i>The disposal of old and <b>obsolete</b> machinery.</i>
<b>old</b>	Used informally especially for emphasis old adj of a very early stage in development. <i>We moved back into our <b>old</b> house.</i>
<b><u>outdated</u></b>	Out of date; obsolete. <i><b>Outdated</b> equipment.</i>
<b>outmoded</b>	Out of fashion. <i>An <b>outmoded</b> Victorian building.</i>
<b>paleolithic</b>	Of or relating to the second period of the Stone Age (following the eolithic). <i><b>Paleolithic</b> artifacts.</i>
<b>passe</b>	Out of fashion.
<b>past</b>	A verb tense that expresses actions or states in the past. <i>Forget the <b>past</b>.</i>
<b>retrograde</b>	Show retrograde motion. <i>All the planets will at some time appear to <b>retrograde</b>.</i>
<b><u>rusty</u></b>	(of black clothes) discoloured by age. <i><b>Rusty</b> deposits.</i>
<b><u>senile</u></b>	(of a person) having or showing the weaknesses or diseases of old age, especially a loss of mental faculties. <i><b>Senile</b> decay.</i>
<b>superannuated</b>	Too old to be useful. <i>A <b>superannuated</b> hippy.</i>

Having no ability or skill in a specified activity or area.

**widower**

A man whose spouse is often away participating in a specified sport or activity.

*Her new found passion has turned me into a tennis **widower**.*
