## Associations of "Dates" (30 Words)

<a href="#">afternoon</a>	In the afternoon every afternoon. <i>He spent a quiet <b>afternoon</b> in the park.</i>
<b>almanac</b>	An annual publication including weather forecasts and other miscellaneous information arranged according to the calendar of a given year.
<a href="#">calendar</a>	Enter into a calendar. <i>I have you on my <b>calendar</b> for next Monday.</i>
<b>celebrate</b>	Reach (a birthday or anniversary). <i><b>Celebrate</b> Christmas.</i>
<b>dawn</b>	Become evident to the mind; be perceived or understood. <i>The awful truth was beginning to <b>dawn</b> on him.</i>
<b>day</b>	Daylight. <i>It was a busy <b>day</b> on the stock exchange.</i>
<b>daybreak</b>	The first light of day. <i>She set off at <b>daybreak</b>.</i>
<b>dew</b>	A beaded or glistening liquid resembling dew. <i>The grass was wet with <b>dew</b>.</i>
<b>engagement</b>	The action of engaging or being engaged. <i>The <b>engagement</b> of the clutch.</i>
<b>expiry</b>	A coming to an end of a contract period. <i>The <b>expiry</b> of the six month period.</i>
<b>monday</b>	The second day of the week; the first working day.
<b>month</b>	A period of time between the same dates in successive calendar months. <i>He paid the bill last <b>month</b>.</i>
<a href="#">morning</a>	Every morning. <i>They talked until <b>morning</b>.</i>
<b>noon</b>	The middle of the day. <i>The service starts at twelve <b>noon</b>.</i>

<b>o'clock</b>	According to the clock.
<b>saturday</b>	The seventh and last day of the week; observed as the Sabbath by Jews and some Christians.
<b><u>schedule</u></b>	Make a schedule plan the time and place for events. <i>Cowley Bridge has already been <b>scheduled</b> and protected as an ancient monument.</i>
<b>sunday</b>	United States evangelist (1862-1935).
<b><u>sunny</u></b>	Bright with sunlight. <i>A <b>sunny</b> smile.</i>
<b><u>sunrise</u></b>	Of an industry or technology; new and developing. <i>A spectacular <b>sunrise</b> over the summit of the mountain.</i>
<b><u>tomorrow</u></b>	The next day, the day after, following the present day. <i>Today s engineers are <b>tomorrow</b> s buyers.</i>
<b>tuesday</b>	The third day of the week; the second working day.
<b>wake</b>	Cause to become awake or conscious. <i>He was attending a friend s <b>wake</b>.</i>
<b>wednesday</b>	The fourth day of the week; the third working day.
<b><u>week</u></b>	Hours or days of work in a calendar week. <i>I work during the <b>week</b> so I can only get to this shop on Saturdays.</i>
<b>weekday</b>	Any day except Sunday (and sometimes except Saturday). <i>The <b>weekday</b> rush hour.</i>
<b>weekend</b>	Spend a weekend somewhere. <i>A <b>weekend</b> break.</i>
<b>workweek</b>	The total number of hours or days worked in a week. <i>We need a shorter <b>workweek</b> and protected benefits for contract workers.</i>
<b><u>year</u></b>	A period of time occupying a regular part of a calendar year that is used for some particular activity. <i>It s almost a <b>year</b> since his heart attack.</i>
<b>yesterday</b>	In the recent past; only a short time ago. <i>It was in <b>yesterday</b> s newspapers.</i>
