Associations of "Dates" (30 Words)

afternoon	In the afternoon every afternoon. <i>He spent a quiet afternoon in the park.</i>
almanac	An annual publication including weather forecasts and other miscellaneous information arranged according to the calendar of a given year.
calendar	Enter into a calendar. <i>I have you on my calendar for next Monday.</i>
celebrate	Reach (a birthday or anniversary). <i>Celebrate Christmas.</i>
dawn	Become evident to the mind; be perceived or understood. <i>The awful truth was beginning to dawn on him.</i>
day	Daylight. <i>It was a busy day on the stock exchange.</i>
daybreak	The first light of day. <i>She set off at daybreak.</i>
dew	A beaded or glistening liquid resembling dew. <i>The grass was wet with dew.</i>
engagement	The action of engaging or being engaged. <i>The engagement of the clutch.</i>
expiry	A coming to an end of a contract period. <i>The expiry of the six month period.</i>
monday	The second day of the week; the first working day.
month	A period of time between the same dates in successive calendar months. <i>He paid the bill last month.</i>
morning	Every morning. <i>They talked until morning.</i>
noon	The middle of the day. <i>The service starts at twelve noon.</i>

o'clock	According to the clock.
saturday	The seventh and last day of the week; observed as the Sabbath by Jews and some Christians.
<u>schedule</u>	Make a schedule plan the time and place for events. <i>Cowley Bridge has already been scheduled and protected as an ancient monument.</i>
sunday	United States evangelist (1862-1935).
<u>sunny</u>	Bright with sunlight. <i>A sunny smile.</i>
<u>sunrise</u>	Of an industry or technology; new and developing. <i>A spectacular sunrise over the summit of the mountain.</i>
<u>tomorrow</u>	The next day, the day after, following the present day. <i>Today s engineers are tomorrow s buyers.</i>
tuesday	The third day of the week; the second working day.
wake	Cause to become awake or conscious. <i>He was attending a friend s wake.</i>
wednesday	The fourth day of the week; the third working day.
<u>week</u>	Hours or days of work in a calendar week. <i>I work during the week so I can only get to this shop on Saturdays.</i>
weekday	Any day except Sunday (and sometimes except Saturday). <i>The weekday rush hour.</i>
weekend	Spend a weekend somewhere. <i>A weekend break.</i>
workweek	The total number of hours or days worked in a week. <i>We need a shorter workweek and protected benefits for contract workers.</i>
<u>year</u>	A period of time occupying a regular part of a calendar year that is used for some particular activity. <i>It s almost a year since his heart attack.</i>
yesterday	In the recent past; only a short time ago. <i>It was in yesterday s newspapers.</i>
