exceptional	Unusually good; outstanding. <i>Exceptional kindness.</i>
extraordinary	(of a meeting) specially convened. <i>An extraordinary desire for approval.</i>
eye-popping	Amazingly impressive; suggestive of the flashing of lightning.
fulgent	Shining intensely. <i>Fulgent patterns of sunlight.</i>
fulgurant	Amazingly impressive; suggestive of the flashing of lightning. <i>Fulgurant candelabras.</i>
fulgurous	Resembling or filled with lightning. <i>Endless purple fulgurous sky.</i>
glaring	Highly obvious or conspicuous. <i>There is a glaring omission in the data.</i>
glary	Shining intensely.
gleaming	Bright with a steady but subdued shining. <i>Gleaming black limousines.</i>
imposing	Impressive in appearance. <i>An imposing 17th century manor house.</i>
impressive	Making a strong or vivid impression. <i>An impressive view of the mountains.</i>
incredible	Beyond belief or understanding. <i>I was mesmerized she looked so incredible.</i>
outstanding	Having a quality that thrusts itself into attention. <i>Did outstanding work in human relations.</i>
phenomenal	Remarkable or exceptional, especially exceptionally good. <i>The phenomenal world.</i>
remarkable	Worthy of attention; striking. <i>A remarkable sight.</i>
shining	Made smooth and bright by or as if by rubbing; reflecting a sheen or glow. <i>Had shining virtues and few faults.</i>
staggering	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>The staggering bills for maintenance and repair.</i>
thrilling	Causing quivering or shivering as by cold or fear or electric shock. <i>A thrilling wind blew off the frozen lake.</i>

*This fight was **brilliantly** choreographed.*

effulgence	The quality of being bright and sending out rays of light.
flash	A newsflash. <i>Carrie flashed a glance in his direction.</i>
glaring	Shining intensely. <i>Their glaring eyes.</i>
gleam	Shine brightly, especially with reflected light. <i>Light gleamed on the china cats.</i>
glimmer	A slight suggestion or vague understanding. <i>There is one glimmer of hope for Becky.</i>
glowing	The amount of electromagnetic radiation leaving or arriving at a point on a surface. <i>He received a glowing report from his teachers.</i>
grandeur	The quality of being magnificent or splendid or grand. <i>The majestic grandeur and simplicity of Roman architecture.</i>
illumination	A condition of spiritual awareness divine illumination. <i>Higher levels of illumination are needed for reading.</i>
illumine	Enlighten (someone) spiritually or intellectually. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was illuminated.</i>
impressive	Making a strong or vivid impression. <i>An impressive ceremony.</i>
lambent	(of light or fire) glowing, gleaming, or flickering with a soft radiance. <i>Lambent tongues of flame.</i>
light	The amount or quality of light in a place. <i>The light was filtered through a soft glass window.</i>
luminosity	The quality of being luminous; emitting or reflecting light. <i>Its luminosity is measured relative to that of our sun.</i>
luminous	Softly bright or radiant. <i>A sky luminous with stars.</i>
luster	A surface coating for ceramics or porcelain.
opalescence	The visual property of something having a milky brightness and a play of colors from the surface.
phosphorescent	Emitting light without appreciable heat as by slow oxidation of phosphorous. <i>The phosphorescent glow of decaying wood.</i>
polish	Improve or perfect by pruning or polishing. <i>I could give the wardrobe a polish.</i>

radiance	An attractive combination of good health and happiness. <i>The radiance of the bride s smile.</i>
radiant	Of an appliance designed to emit radiant energy especially for cooking or heating. <i>A radiant heater.</i>
shine	Make a surface shine. <i>Shine the silver please.</i>
shining	Reflecting light. <i>The shining of shoes provided a meager living.</i>
splendid	Very good;of the highest quality. <i>He was a splendid teacher.</i>
sunshine	Moderate weather; suitable for outdoor activities. <i>Hand it over sunshine.</i>
