amazing	Inspiring awe or admiration or wonder. An amazing number of people registered.
<u>astonishing</u>	Surprising greatly. Such an enormous response was astonishing .
<u>blazing</u>	Very hot. A blazing indiscretion.
<u>blinding</u>	Shining intensely. Blinding headlights.
<u>breathtaking</u>	Astonishing or awe-inspiring in quality, so as to take one's breath away. <i>Breathtaking</i> adventure.
brilliant	Outstanding; impressive. A brilliant mind.
coruscating	Severely critical; scathing. His coruscating attack on the Prime Minister.



exceptional	Unusually good; outstanding. <i>Exceptional</i> kindness.
extraordinary	(of a meeting) specially convened. An extraordinary desire for approval.
eye-popping	Amazingly impressive; suggestive of the flashing of lightning.
fulgent	Shining intensely. <i>Fulgent</i> patterns of sunlight.
fulgurant	Amazingly impressive; suggestive of the flashing of lightning. <i>Fulgurant</i> candelabras.
fulgurous	Resembling or filled with lightning. Endless purple fulgurous sky.
glaring	Highly obvious or conspicuous. There is a glaring omission in the data.
glary	Shining intensely.
gleaming	Bright with a steady but subdued shining. <i>Gleaming</i> black limousines.
imposing	Impressive in appearance. An imposing 17th century manor house.
<u>impressive</u>	Making a strong or vivid impression. An impressive view of the mountains.
incredible	Beyond belief or understanding. I was mesmerized she looked so incredible .
outstanding	Having a quality that thrusts itself into attention. Did outstanding work in human relations.
<u>phenomenal</u>	Remarkable or exceptional, especially exceptionally good. The phenomenal world.
remarkable	Worthy of attention; striking. A remarkable sight.
shining	Made smooth and bright by or as if by rubbing; reflecting a sheen or glow. <i>Had shining virtues and few faults.</i>
<u>staggering</u>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. The staggering bills for maintenance and repair.
<u>thrilling</u>	Causing quivering or shivering as by cold or fear or electric shock. A thrilling wind blew off the frozen lake.

Associations of "Dazzling" (30 Words)

<u>beam</u>	Express with a beaming face or smile. <i>Mission controller beam me up.</i>
<u>bright</u>	Made smooth and bright by or as if by rubbing reflecting a sheen or glow. The bright sound of the trumpet section.
brightly	With brightness. A wry brightly written essay.
<u>brightness</u>	Sunny, cloudless weather. There had been some brightness in her life.
brilliance	The quality of being magnificent or splendid or grand. The nights were dark lit only by the brilliance of Aegean stars.
brilliantly	With brightness. This fight was brilliantly choreographed.



effulgence	The quality of being bright and sending out rays of light.
flash	A newsflash. Carrie flash ed a glance in his direction.
<u>glaring</u>	Shining intensely. Their glaring eyes.
<u>gleam</u>	Shine brightly, especially with reflected light. Light gleam ed on the china cats.
glimmer	A slight suggestion or vague understanding. There is one glimmer of hope for Becky.
<u>glowing</u>	The amount of electromagnetic radiation leaving or arriving at a point on a surface. <i>He received a glowing report from his teachers.</i>
grandeur	The quality of being magnificent or splendid or grand. The majestic grandeur and simplicity of Roman architecture.
illumination	A condition of spiritual awareness divine illumination. <i>Higher levels of illumination are needed for reading.</i>
illumine	Enlighten (someone) spiritually or intellectually. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was illumined.</i>
<u>impressive</u>	Making a strong or vivid impression. An impressive ceremony.
lambent	(of light or fire) glowing, gleaming, or flickering with a soft radiance. <i>Lambent</i> tongues of flame.
light	The amount or quality of light in a place. The light was filtered through a soft glass window.
luminosity	The quality of being luminous; emitting or reflecting light. Its luminosity is measured relative to that of our sun.
luminous	Softly bright or radiant. A sky luminous with stars.
luster	A surface coating for ceramics or porcelain.
opalescence	The visual property of something having a milky brightness and a play of colors from the surface.
phosphorescent	Emitting light without appreciable heat as by slow oxidation of phosphorous. The phosphorescent glow of decaying wood.
polish	Improve or perfect by pruning or polishing. I could give the wardrobe a polish .



radiance	An attractive combination of good health and happiness. The radiance of the bride s smile.
radiant	Of an appliance designed to emit radiant energy especially for cooking or heating. A radiant heater.
shine	Make a surface shine. <i>Shine</i> the silver please.
shining	Reflecting light. The shining of shoes provided a meager living.
splendid	Very good;of the highest quality. <i>He was a splendid teacher.</i>
sunshine	Moderate weather; suitable for outdoor activities. Hand it over sunshine .
