Associations of "Dead end" (30 Words)

casualty	Someone injured or killed in an accident. <i>He went to casualty to have a cut stitched.</i>
<u>closing</u>	The act of closing something. <i>The closing stages of the election.</i>
completion	The action or process of completing or finishing something. <i>Funds for the completion of the new building.</i>
culmination	(astronomy) a heavenly body's highest celestial point above an observer's horizon. <i>The deal marked the culmination of years of negotiation.</i>
<u>decease</u>	Pass from physical life and lose all bodily attributes and functions necessary to sustain life. <i>He deceased at his palace of Croydon.</i>
deceased	The recently dead person in question. <i>He is deceased.</i>
<u>demise</u>	The end or failure of an enterprise or institution. <i>Mr Grisenthwaite's tragic demise.</i>
<u>destination</u>	The place designated as the end (as of a race or journey). <i>Delft is an ideal destination for a relaxing weekend.</i>
die	A cutting tool that is fitted into a diestock and used for cutting male external screw threads on screws or bolts or pipes or rods. <i>Rhubarb dies back to a crown of buds each winter.</i>
done	Socially acceptable. <i>Therapy was not the done thing then.</i>
<u>doom</u>	Pronounce a sentence on (somebody) in a court of law. <i>Everyone was aware of the approaching doom but was helpless to avoid it.</i>
<u>dying</u>	On the point of death. <i>The making of valves is a dying art.</i>

epilogue	A short passage added at the end of a literary work. <i>The epilogue told what eventually happened to the main characters.</i>
expiry	The end of a fixed period of time. <i>An expiry date.</i>
final	The final approach of an aircraft to the runway it will be landing on. <i>The decision of the judging panel is final.</i>
finale	The temporal end; the concluding time. <i>The finale of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony.</i>
finis	The end (printed at the end of a book or shown at the end of a film). <i>The market was up at the finis.</i>
intestacy	The situation of being or dying without a legally valid will.
intestate	Not having made a will before one dies. <i>He died intestate.</i>
last	The last or lowest in an ordering or series. <i>He was dead having refused morphia to the last.</i>
misadventure	Death caused by a person accidentally while performing a legal act without negligence or intent to harm. <i>The coroner recorded a verdict of death by misadventure.</i>
moribund	Being on the point of death; breathing your last. <i>On examination she was moribund and dehydrated.</i>
mortuary	Relating to burial or tombs. <i>A mortuary temple.</i>
perish	Die, especially in a violent or sudden way. <i>An abandoned tyre whose rubber had perished.</i>
peroration	A flowery and highly rhetorical oration. <i>He again invoked the theme in an emotional peroration.</i>
quietus	Euphemisms for death (based on an analogy between lying in a bed and in a tomb).
rip	The act of rending or ripping or splitting something. <i>Countries ripped apart by fighting.</i>
suffocation	Difficulty in breathing. <i>Suffocation by smoke inhalation.</i>
windup	A concluding action. <i>Windup toys.</i>
wrought	Made or fashioned in the specified way. <i>Well wrought pop music.</i>
