## Associations of "Dead end" (30 Words)

<b>casualty</b>	Someone injured or killed in an accident. <i>He went to <b>casualty</b> to have a cut stitched.</i>
<a href="#"><u>closing</u></a>	The act of closing something. <i>The <b>closing</b> stages of the election.</i>
<b>completion</b>	The action or process of completing or finishing something. <i>Funds for the <b>completion</b> of the new building.</i>
<b>culmination</b>	(astronomy) a heavenly body's highest celestial point above an observer's horizon. <i>The deal marked the <b>culmination</b> of years of negotiation.</i>
<a href="#"><u>decease</u></a>	Pass from physical life and lose all bodily attributes and functions necessary to sustain life. <i>He <b>deceased</b> at his palace of Croydon.</i>
<b>deceased</b>	The recently dead person in question. <i>He is <b>deceased</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>demise</u></a>	The end or failure of an enterprise or institution. <i>Mr Grisenthwaite's tragic <b>demise</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>destination</u></a>	The place designated as the end (as of a race or journey). <i>Delft is an ideal <b>destination</b> for a relaxing weekend.</i>
<b>die</b>	A cutting tool that is fitted into a diestock and used for cutting male external screw threads on screws or bolts or pipes or rods. <i>Rhubarb <b>dies</b> back to a crown of buds each winter.</i>
<b>done</b>	Socially acceptable. <i>Therapy was not the <b>done</b> thing then.</i>
<a href="#"><u>doom</u></a>	Pronounce a sentence on (somebody) in a court of law. <i>Everyone was aware of the approaching <b>doom</b> but was helpless to avoid it.</i>
<a href="#"><u>dying</u></a>	On the point of death. <i>The making of valves is a <b>dying</b> art.</i>

<b>epilogue</b>	A short passage added at the end of a literary work. <i>The <b>epilogue</b> told what eventually happened to the main characters.</i>
<b>expiry</b>	The end of a fixed period of time. <i>An <b>expiry</b> date.</i>
<b>final</b>	The final approach of an aircraft to the runway it will be landing on. <i>The decision of the judging panel is <b>final</b>.</i>
<b>finale</b>	The temporal end; the concluding time. <i>The <b>finale</b> of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony.</i>
<b>finis</b>	The end (printed at the end of a book or shown at the end of a film). <i>The market was up at the <b>finis</b>.</i>
<b>intestacy</b>	The situation of being or dying without a legally valid will.
<b>intestate</b>	Not having made a will before one dies. <i>He died <b>intestate</b>.</i>
<b>last</b>	The last or lowest in an ordering or series. <i>He was dead having refused morphia to the <b>last</b>.</i>
<b>misadventure</b>	Death caused by a person accidentally while performing a legal act without negligence or intent to harm. <i>The coroner recorded a verdict of death by <b>misadventure</b>.</i>
<b>moribund</b>	Being on the point of death; breathing your last. <i>On examination she was <b>moribund</b> and dehydrated.</i>
<b>mortuary</b>	Relating to burial or tombs. <i>A <b>mortuary</b> temple.</i>
<b>perish</b>	Die, especially in a violent or sudden way. <i>An abandoned tyre whose rubber had <b>perished</b>.</i>
<b>peroration</b>	A flowery and highly rhetorical oration. <i>He again invoked the theme in an emotional <b>peroration</b>.</i>
<b>quietus</b>	Euphemisms for death (based on an analogy between lying in a bed and in a tomb).
<b>rip</b>	The act of rending or ripping or splitting something. <i>Countries <b>ripped</b> apart by fighting.</i>
<b>suffocation</b>	Difficulty in breathing. <i><b>Suffocation</b> by smoke inhalation.</i>
<b>windup</b>	A concluding action. <i><b>Windup</b> toys.</i>
<b>wrought</b>	Made or fashioned in the specified way. <i>Well <b>wrought</b> pop music.</i>
