| <u>demise</u> | A person's death. Mr Grisenthwaite s tragic demise . |
| done | (of food) cooked thoroughly. It s a done deed. |
| exhalation | Exhaled breath. Moist exhalation s from the sea. |
| expiration | A coming to an end of a contract period. The expiration of the lease. |
| expire | (of a document, authorization, or agreement) come to the end of the period of validity. My passports expire d last month. |
| expired | Having come to an end or become void after passage of a period of time. <i>Caught driving with an</i> expired <i>license</i> . |
| expiry | The end of the period for which something is valid. <i>The expiry of his driver s license.</i> |



| filing | Preservation and methodical arrangement as of documents and papers etc. Iron filing s. |

| <u>final</u> | The final match between the winners of all previous matches in an elimination tournament. The plane piloted by Richards was on final s. |
| inoperative | Not working or taking effect. <i>The Act may be rendered inoperative.</i> |
| intestacy | The situation of being or dying without a legally valid will. |
| intestate | Having made no legally valid will before death or not disposed of by a legal will. |
| <u>invalid</u> | Intestate property. Injure permanently. Invalid reasoning. |
| last | The last mention or sight of someone or something. <i>Last</i> I ll discuss family values. |
| month | A period of time between the same dates in successive calendar months. <i>The first six months of 1992.</i> |
| mortality | The quality or state of being mortal. The work is increasingly haunted by thoughts of mortality . |
| <u>null</u> | Combine a signal with another in order to create a null cancel out. The tumour can be more readily identified by null ing the high signal from bone marrow. |
| passe | Out of fashion. |
| passing | In sport the action of passing a ball to another team member. The passing of winter. |
| perish | Suffer complete ruin or destruction. I was perish ed with cold before the end of the day. |
| rip | The act of rending or ripping or splitting something. Countries rip ped apart by fighting. |
| submission | A contention presented by a lawyer to a judge or jury as part of the case he is arguing. The union was brought into submission . |
| termination | A coming to an end of a contract period. Workers were informed of the termination s on Wednesday. |
| <u>ultimatum</u> | A final peremptory demand. <i>Their employers issued an ultimatum demanding an immediate return to</i> <i>work.</i> |
