## Associations of "Deadlines" (30 Words)

<b><u>date</u></b>	Mark with a date. <i>They are up to <b>date</b>.</i>
<b><u>dated</u></b>	Marked with a date. <i>A <b>dated</b> expression.</i>
<b><u>dead</u></b>	Not circulating or flowing. <i>Red flares were seen <b>dead</b> ahead.</i>
<b><u>decease</u></b>	The event of dying or departure from life. <i>He <b>deceased</b> at his palace of Croydon.</i>
<b>deceased</b>	The recently dead person in question. <i>The will of Christopher Smith <b>deceased</b>.</i>
<b>defunct</b>	Having ceased to exist or live. <i>A <b>defunct</b> organization.</i>
<b><u>demise</u></b>	A person's death. <i>Mr Grisenthwaite s tragic <b>demise</b>.</i>
<b>done</b>	(of food) cooked thoroughly. <i>It s a <b>done</b> deed.</i>
<b>exhalation</b>	Exhaled breath. <i>Moist <b>exhalations</b> from the sea.</i>
<b>expiration</b>	A coming to an end of a contract period. <i>The <b>expiration</b> of the lease.</i>
<b>expire</b>	(of a document, authorization, or agreement) come to the end of the period of validity. <i>My passports <b>expired</b> last month.</i>
<b>expired</b>	Having come to an end or become void after passage of a period of time. <i>Caught driving with an <b>expired</b> license.</i>
<b>expiry</b>	The end of the period for which something is valid. <i>The <b>expiry</b> of his driver s license.</i>

<b>filing</b>	Preservation and methodical arrangement as of documents and papers etc. <i>Iron <b>filings</b>.</i>
<b>final</b>	The final match between the winners of all previous matches in an elimination tournament. <i>The plane piloted by Richards was on <b>finals</b>.</i>
<b>inoperative</b>	Not working or taking effect. <i>The Act may be rendered <b>inoperative</b>.</i>
<b>intestacy</b>	The situation of being or dying without a legally valid will.
<b>intestate</b>	Having made no legally valid will before death or not disposed of by a legal will. <i><b>Intestate</b> property.</i>
<b>invalid</b>	Injure permanently. <i><b>Invalid</b> reasoning.</i>
<b>last</b>	The last mention or sight of someone or something. <i><b>Last</b> I ll discuss family values.</i>
<b>month</b>	A period of time between the same dates in successive calendar months. <i>The first six <b>months</b> of 1992.</i>
<b>mortality</b>	The quality or state of being mortal. <i>The work is increasingly haunted by thoughts of <b>mortality</b>.</i>
<b>null</b>	Combine a signal with another in order to create a null cancel out. <i>The tumour can be more readily identified by <b>nulling</b> the high signal from bone marrow.</i>
<b>passe</b>	Out of fashion.
<b>passing</b>	In sport the action of passing a ball to another team member. <i>The <b>passing</b> of winter.</i>
<b>perish</b>	Suffer complete ruin or destruction. <i>I was <b>perished</b> with cold before the end of the day.</i>
<b>rip</b>	The act of rending or ripping or splitting something. <i>Countries <b>ripped</b> apart by fighting.</i>
<b>submission</b>	A contention presented by a lawyer to a judge or jury as part of the case he is arguing. <i>The union was brought into <b>submission</b>.</i>
<b>termination</b>	A coming to an end of a contract period. <i>Workers were informed of the <b>terminations</b> on Wednesday.</i>
<b>ultimatum</b>	A final peremptory demand. <i>Their employers issued an <b>ultimatum</b> demanding an immediate return to work.</i>
