Associations of "Deadlines" (30 Words)

<u>date</u>	Mark with a date. <i>They are up to date.</i>
<u>dated</u>	Marked with a date. <i>A dated expression.</i>
<u>dead</u>	Not circulating or flowing. <i>Red flares were seen dead ahead.</i>
<u>decease</u>	The event of dying or departure from life. <i>He deceased at his palace of Croydon.</i>
deceased	The recently dead person in question. <i>The will of Christopher Smith deceased.</i>
defunct	Having ceased to exist or live. <i>A defunct organization.</i>
<u>demise</u>	A person's death. <i>Mr Grisenthwaite s tragic demise.</i>
done	(of food) cooked thoroughly. <i>It s a done deed.</i>
exhalation	Exhaled breath. <i>Moist exhalations from the sea.</i>
expiration	A coming to an end of a contract period. <i>The expiration of the lease.</i>
expire	(of a document, authorization, or agreement) come to the end of the period of validity. <i>My passports expired last month.</i>
expired	Having come to an end or become void after passage of a period of time. <i>Caught driving with an expired license.</i>
expiry	The end of the period for which something is valid. <i>The expiry of his driver s license.</i>

filing	Preservation and methodical arrangement as of documents and papers etc. <i>Iron filings.</i>
final	The final match between the winners of all previous matches in an elimination tournament. <i>The plane piloted by Richards was on finals.</i>
inoperative	Not working or taking effect. <i>The Act may be rendered inoperative.</i>
intestacy	The situation of being or dying without a legally valid will.
intestate	Having made no legally valid will before death or not disposed of by a legal will. <i>Intestate property.</i>
invalid	Injure permanently. <i>Invalid reasoning.</i>
last	The last mention or sight of someone or something. <i>Last I ll discuss family values.</i>
month	A period of time between the same dates in successive calendar months. <i>The first six months of 1992.</i>
mortality	The quality or state of being mortal. <i>The work is increasingly haunted by thoughts of mortality.</i>
null	Combine a signal with another in order to create a null cancel out. <i>The tumour can be more readily identified by nulling the high signal from bone marrow.</i>
passe	Out of fashion.
passing	In sport the action of passing a ball to another team member. <i>The passing of winter.</i>
perish	Suffer complete ruin or destruction. <i>I was perished with cold before the end of the day.</i>
rip	The act of rending or ripping or splitting something. <i>Countries ripped apart by fighting.</i>
submission	A contention presented by a lawyer to a judge or jury as part of the case he is arguing. <i>The union was brought into submission.</i>
termination	A coming to an end of a contract period. <i>Workers were informed of the terminations on Wednesday.</i>
ultimatum	A final peremptory demand. <i>Their employers issued an ultimatum demanding an immediate return to work.</i>
