## Associations of "Debilitating" (30 Words)

<a href="#">arduous</a>	Taxing to the utmost; testing powers of endurance. <i>The <b>arduous</b> work of preparing a dictionary.</i>
<b>backbreaking</b>	Characterized by effort to the point of exhaustion; especially physical effort.
<b>bored</b>	Feeling weary and impatient because one is unoccupied or lacks interest in one's current activity. <i>The <b>bored</b> gaze of the successful film star.</i>
<b>boring</b>	The act of drilling a hole in the earth in the hope of producing petroleum. <i>A <b>boring</b> evening with uninteresting people.</i>
<b>disease</b>	A disorder of structure or function in a human, animal, or plant, especially one that produces specific symptoms or that affects a specific location and is not simply a direct result of physical injury. <i>We are suffering from the British <b>disease</b> of self deprecation.</i>
<b>draining</b>	Having a debilitating effect.
<b>emotionally</b>	In an emotional manner. <i>An opportunity for parent and child to connect <b>emotionally</b>.</i>
<b>ennui</b>	The feeling of being bored by something tedious. <i>He succumbed to <b>ennui</b> and despair.</i>
<b>erosion</b>	Erosion by chemical action. <i>The <b>erosion</b> of support for the party.</i>
<b>exhausting</b>	Producing exhaustion. <i>An <b>exhausting</b> march.</i>
<a href="#">grueling</a>	Characterized by effort to the point of exhaustion; especially physical effort. <i>A <b>grueling</b> campaign.</i>
<b>humdrum</b>	Tediously repetitious or lacking in variety. <i><b>Humdrum</b> routine work.</i>

<b>illness</b>	Impairment of normal physiological function affecting part or all of an organism. <i>I ve never missed a day s work through <b>illness</b>.</i>
<b>irksome</b>	So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness. <i>An <b>irksome</b> journey.</i>
<b>monotonous</b>	(of a sound or utterance) lacking in variation in tone or pitch. <i>The statistics that he quotes with <b>monotonous</b> regularity.</i>
<b>onerous</b>	Not easily borne; wearing. <i>An <b>onerous</b> lease.</i>
<b>overtax</b>	Require to pay too much tax. <i>Do athletes <b>overtax</b> their hearts.</i>
<b>physical</b>	Impelled by physical force especially against resistance. <i>A very <b>physical</b> dance performance.</i>
<b>plumbing</b>	The work of installing and maintaining a plumbing system. <i>The kitchen has a gas cooker point and <b>plumbing</b> for an automatic washing machine.</i>
<b>taxing</b>	Not easily borne; wearing. <i>They find the work too <b>taxing</b>.</i>
<b>tedious</b>	Too long, slow, or dull; tiresome or monotonous. <i>A <b>tedious</b> journey.</i>
<b>tire</b>	Exhaust or get tired through overuse or great strain or stress. <i>The media will <b>tire</b> of publicizing every protest.</i>
<b>tired</b>	In need of sleep or rest; weary. <i>She was <b>tired</b> out now that the strain was over.</i>
<b>tiresome</b>	So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness. <i>Weeding is a <b>tiresome</b> but essential job.</i>
<b>tiring</b>	Causing one to need rest or sleep; fatiguing. <i>It had been a <b>tiring</b> day.</i>
<b>toilet</b>	A room building or cubicle containing a toilet or toilets. <i>Pensions are in the <b>toilet</b>.</i>
<b>toilsome</b>	Involving hard or tedious work. <i><b>Toilsome</b> chores.</i>
<b>uninteresting</b>	Characteristic or suggestive of an institution especially in being uniform or dull or unimaginative. <i>A very <b>uninteresting</b> account of her trip.</i>

<b>wearing</b>	Geology the mechanical process of wearing or grinding something down as by particles washing over it. <i>A plan of action will make the whole event a less <b>wearing</b> experience.</i>
<b>wearisome</b>	Causing one to feel tired or bored. <i>Other people s dreams are dreadfully <b>wearisome</b>.</i>
